

Sixty thousand people packed Ramat Gan National Stadium for the festive Opening Ceremonies, and cheered as more than 4,000 athletes from 43 nations circled the stadium track.

A Lifetime to Remember



It was one of those magical moments you might see only once in a lifetime. As the first-ever Soviet delegation to the Maccabiah Games circled Ramat Gan Stadium to the thunderous applause of the 60,000-strong Opening Ceremonies crowd, several members of the U.S. team ran onto the field to greet their counterparts. Many fought back tears as hugs and high-fives were exchanged. It was a moment which set the tone for the ten days yet to come—a truly triumphant 13th World Maccabiah Games.

For all who took part, memories like these will last forever. From joining with our Soviet brothers to climbing atop Masada, the Maccabiah is much more than a sporting event. And this, the Bar Mitzvah Maccabiah, was surely the greatest to date. For the U.S. Team, the Games were a great success both on and off the field. The team flight touched down at Ben Gurion Airport outside Tel Aviv a week before the Games began for the first USA Team Pre-Camp in Israel, sponsored by the Horace W. Goldsmith Foundation. For the athletes, it was a week of experiencing Israel and making new friends.

Trips to Jerusalem, Yad Vashem (the Holocaust memorial) and Masada allowed the athletes a chance to better understand their own culture and heritage. In fact, several athletes were Bar and Bat Mitzvahed at Masada in a special ceremony.

As Pre-Camp ended, the athletes split up by teams to join athletes in their sport from other countries. The Maccabiah is the only international sporting event which houses athletes according to their sport, and the results are quite successful. Cultural and language barriers are overcome, as the athletes share the unique experience of the Maccabiah together. "It was a fantastic experience meeting people from around the world," said U.S. softball player Barry Carron.

Hundreds of children performed and fireworks lit up the sky, as athletes from 43 nations were welcomed at the Opening Ceremonies. Hanoch Budin, 1988 Israeli Paralympic champion, carried the torch into Ramat Gan Stadium and kindled the Maccabiah flame to officially begin the Games.

Over the next 10 days, the level of competition was raised to new heights. Maccabiah records were shattered across the country, as the U.S. and Israel dominated the venues. The Americans went on to win 199 medals, second only to Israel.

Highlights included a dramatic U.S. gold in softball and an incredible performance by the American swimmers. In all, the U.S. won 46 medals and set 15 records at Tel Aviv University Pool. Two Olympians, hammer thrower Ken Flax and rower Sherri Cassuto, also won golds for the U.S.

"We knew we would perform well, but that was not our primary goal," said U.S. Team General Chairman Robert Spivak. "Instead, it was to allow our athletes to experience the culture and heritage of the Israeli people, and share a very special two weeks making friends from around the world that would last a lifetime."


The U.S. athletes had an opportunity to experience Israel firsthand, as hundreds of Israeli families opened their homes to share in Shabbat dinner. For many of the athletes, it was a night they'll never forget. "I spent a fantastic evening with a wonderful family," said Jimi Yarkin of the U.S. Judo team. "This was truly one of the highlights of the trip for me."

As the competition came to an end, everyone gathered one final time for the Closing Ceremonies. The athletes marched triumphantly through the streets of Jerusalem as enthusiastic crowds cheered them on. The march ended at the Western Wall, where participants from each of the 13 Games took part in the festivities and the Maccabiah flame was extinguished.

The flame will be rekindled for the 14th Games in four years, but special memories from this Maccabiah will surely not be forgotten. After all, some magical moments you only see once in a lifetime.

As tears of joy were shed at the 2,000-year-old Western Wall in Jerusalem, the Wall which symbolized 45 years of repression and struggle was crumbling in Eastern Europe. For hundreds of thousands of Jews who had lived under the dark shadow of the Berlin Wall, it marked a new beginning of hope and freedom.

The face of the world has changed dramatically in recent years. As the Iron Curtain has opened, the people of Eastern Europe have won many of the political and religious freedoms for which they have long fought. For Jews throughout the Diaspora, these events have given cause for cautious optimism and dreams of a brighter future.

The signs look promising. Only months after Maccabi U.S.S.R. was formed in 1989, Lithuania returned





Raising the funds needed to make the 13th Maccabiah the most successful ever for all those involved.



The dream of a Jewish homeland had finally been realized in 1948, but its future was uncertain. Israel would need support from friends throughout the Diaspora if it was to survive and prosper. Four men decided that they could make a difference, by helping Israel develop its full potential through sports. Thus, in 1948, began the United States Committee Sports for Israel.

Those men—Harold Zimman, Harry Henshel, Charles Ornstein and Edward Rosenblum—created an organization which has meant so much to Jewish youth in the U.S. and Israel over the past 40 years. Through athletics, U.S. Committee has helped Israel develop as a nation and fostered relationships with Jews worldwide.



As the official representative of Maccabi World Union in the United States, USCSFI is involved with many Maccabi

projects including the World Maccabiah Games, Pan Am Maccabi Games, Australian Maccabi Carnival and the North American Maccabi Youth Games.

Co-founded by USCSFI, the Youth Games were first held in Memphis, TN in 1982. The Games, which are designed for

athletes age 13–16, have grown tremendously over the past few years. Over 3,000 young athletes from five continents took part in the 1988 Youth Games in Chicago, and the fifth Games will take place in Detroit in 1990.

In 1987, U.S. Committee sponsored a team of 110 athletes, coaches and trainers to the 6th Pan Am Maccabi Games in Caracas, Venezuela. Hundreds of Jewish athletes from throughout North, South and Central America took part in the competition. USCSFI also sent the first-ever American team to the 56th Australian Maccabi Carnival at the close of 1988.

U.S. Committee has done much to promote and expand sports programs and

facilities in Israel, as well. In 1957, USCSFI helped found the Wingate Institute for Physical Education and Sport in Netanya. With Sports for Israel's help, Wingate is now comprised of four schools, a Department for Research and Sports Medicine and a training center for Israel's top athletes.

USCSFI is also a supporter of the Israel Sports Center for the Disabled, the

USCSFI originated the International



Jewish Sports Hall of Fame in 1979 to honor outstanding Jewish sports figures from around the world. The IJSHOF Museum, where nearly 150 sportsmen and women are now honored, was dedicated at Wingate in 1981.

USCSFI is also involved in many other projects which have helped Israel grow as a nation through physical education and sports. The four men who founded U.S. Committee





Scenes like these are what made the first U.S. Pre-Camp in Israel such a success. The U.S. Team spent four days experiencing Israel, making new friends and preparing for the competition that lay ahead.

Visits to Jerusalem, Yad Vashem (the Holocaust Memorial) and Masada gave the athletes a chance to learn more about their heritage. Another highlight of the Pre-Camp was a seminar by the Melitz Foundation, in which athletes had a chance to discuss their feelings about Judaism and Israel.



On Thursday, the teams packed up and headed to their respective accommodation centers for the rest of the Games. The Maccabiah is the only international sporting event which houses the participants according to their sport, not country. This gives the athletes a chance to share the Maccabiah experience with friends from around the world.



It had been a very special four days for the U.S. Team. Now, they could now set their sights on Monday night—when 60,000 people would fill Ramat Gan National Stadium for the Opening Ceremonies and the official beginning of the 13th World Maccabiah Games.










Israeli President Chaim Herzog and Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir were among the 60,000 spectators on hand for the festivities. Electricity filled the air as over 4,000 athletes from 43 nations paraded around the stadium track.



The Israeli evening sky was transformed into a beautiful sea of colors, as thousands of balloons filled the air above Ramat Gan National Stadium. It marked the beginning of a spectacular night of pageantry and celebration-the Opening Ceremonies of the 13th Maccabiah Games.

The crowd saved their biggest applause for the delegation from Lithuania, returning after a 50-year absence from the Games. Many fought back tears as members of the U.S. Team ran onto the track to greet their Soviet counterparts. All of the athletes were welcomed in Hebrew, English and Spanish before moving to their seats to enjoy the spectacle. Suddenly, the stadium lights were extinguished and the crowd rose to its feet as a lone torchbearer entered the Stadium. Hanoch Budin—Lebanon war veteran, amputee swimmer and Seoul Paralympics gold medalist—climbed the stadium steps and proudly lit the Maccabiah flame to mark the beginning of the 13th Games. Budin was the last of 500 runners who relayed the torch across Israel from Modi'im, the birthplace of the Maccabees.



As the lights came up, hundreds of youngsters poured onto the field to present a colorful synchronized dance performance. Later, dancers in Hassidic garb stepped to the sounds of "Fiddler on the Roof." The Bar Mitzvah theme was carried throughout the ceremonies in celebration of the 13th Maccabiah. Fireworks, skydivers and a laser show capped off the evening's planned activities, before hundreds of athletes joined in for some impromptu Israeli folkdancing.

What began two weeks earlier with a march of 43 different countries, would culminate in a parade of athletes walking as one through the streets of Jerusalem. It was one of the many unforgettable images of the 13th World Maccabiah Games, which ended as triumphantly as they began.

The "parade of nations" made its way through the streets of the Old City before concluding in a ceremony at the Western Wall. The ceremony was opened by 100 torch-bearers, who had come to Israel from around the world to celebrate their Bar and Bat Mitzvahs.

Prime Minister Shamir greeted the crowd as dusk fell over Jerusalem. An athlete from every Maccabiah took part in the



festivities, as a flame was lit representing each of the 13 Games. As the ceremony came to an end, fireworks filled the sky and illuminated the ancient walls—walls which had stood since the time of the Maccabees.





Tragedy Amid the Triumph


There was a very tragic sidebar to the triumphant story of the 13th Maccabiah Games. On Thursday, July 6, a terrorist seized the steering wheel of a Jerusalem-bound Egged bus from Tel Aviv and sent it crashing into a ravine. Fourteen people were killed.

It was a brutal reminder of the volatile nature of Israel and the Middle East. It is a land of many contradictions—of war and peace; love and hate. The paradox was never greater.

Upon arriving at the gymnastics competition in Jerusalem, gymnast Sigall Kassutto heard about the attack. "To me, it was another one of many crazy terrorist attacks," she said. "That was soon to all change. Everything changes when . . . it is someone you know. The point is that it's always someone that someone knows, only you don't feel it until it hits home. I was later to learn that my mother was on that bus." Sigall's mother, Eliezra Kassutto, survived the crash but will always be haunted by its memory. For her and many others, the 13th Maccabiah Games will be remembered with a wide range of emotions. There was, indeed, tragedy amid the triumph, but the spirit of the Maccabees continues to live on.


Simon Atlas General Chairman
