

ACCOMMODATIONS


A limited number of accommodations (Bed & Breakfast in double-room occupancy) will be available at the Wingate Institute Sport Hotel (on a "first-come, first-served" basis), in dormitories or in mobile homes on campus (all fully air-conditioned). There are also accomodations at various classes of hotels in the city of Netanya (8 Km north of Wingate Institute), available to congress participants at special rates. The hotels are located near the beach and close to many pubs and restaurants.

FACILITIES

The Wingate Institute Sports Complex is located due south of Netanya on the Mediterranean coast line, some fifteen miles north of Tel Aviv. Facilities on campus include swimming pools, gymnasia, playing fields and stadiums. There is also access to the beach from the Institute. The Institute's 52,000 volume multi-lingual library is Israel's largest collection of books on physical education and sports. The Institute has wellequipped laboratories for biomechanics, physiology of exercise and physical fitness, motor learning, and educational technology. Students and faculty involved in research can make use of the Institute's computer center and research facilities. A dining room and cafeterias are also located on campus.

ACCOMPANYING PERSONS' PROGRAM

Registered accompanying persons will be invited to the opening ceremony, welcome reception, folklore program, and farewell party. In addition to the one-day tour for all foreign participants, two half-day tours will be organized.

MEALS

ENTRY TO ISRAEL

Israel requires entry visas from a number of countries. Please check with your travel agent. International flights usually land at Ben Gurion International Airport. Transportation to the conference hotels will be provided by the Organizing Committee. This service can only be provided to those who inform us of their flight arrival details.


Public transportation from Ben Gurion Airport is by "Egged" bus No. 947 which leaves every 20 minutes for the Netanya Central Bus Station (last one at 21.05 hrs), and costs approximately US \$ 5.00 per person, or by taxi, approximately US \$ 40.00. Representatives of the Organizing Committee will provide assistance outside the Ben Gurion Arrival Hall. You may also enter Israel by air via Egypt, in which case an entry visa is required, regardless of citizenship. You may enter via Jordan through the north or south borders with Israel. You may also arrive via charter flights to Eilat - Israel's beautiful southern resort on the Red Sea. Connections to Tel Aviv are available by Arkia (Israel's domestic airline), or by bus (approximate time of bus ride: 6 hours; cost: about US \$ 35.00 per person).

WEATHER

The weather in Israel in July is sunny and quite warm, with temperatures ranging between 28°C (82°F) at mid-day to about 20°C (66°F) in the evenings. Humidity is around 60%.

CLOTHING

Informal, light clothing is appropriate for all occasions. Do not forget swim suits, sunglasses, and walking shoes. The strong sun in Israel requires some kind of head covering for any daytime outdoor activity.

CALL FOR PAPERS AND GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION

PRESENTATION FORMATS

Presentations can be accommodated in the following formats: oral presentations, poster sessions, symposia, round-table discussions, panel discussions.

- A POSTER SESSION consists of physical displays of information, usually reporting empirical research. These sessions last 60-90 minutes, during which the presenter must be available for individualized, informal discussions between presenter and participants. The display panel is 100 cm width X 150 cm height.
- 2. A ROUND TABLE is a 40-minute group discussion with an individual author/moderator, about a paper, project, or specific issue.
- 3. A PANEL DISCUSSION consists of several speakers' responses to a question or an issue with time allotted for interaction among the panel of speakers, as well as between the panel and the audience. Each panel has a moderator (who may or may not have organized the panel) who is expected to regulate the flow of discussion or debate. Panel discussions may last 60 or 90 minutes.
- 4. A SYMPOSIUM is a series of 15-25 minute presentations, each organized around some empirical, conceptual topic. The symposium should promote discussion of a current or needed research or issue. Following a brief presentation by each member of the symposium, extensive interaction among presenters and the audience is expected. The session is organized and submitted by the symposium's chair, who also serves as moderator during the session. Symposia may be scheduled for 60 or 90 minutes.

5. AN ORAL PRESENTATION (20 minutes including 5 minutes for discussion) is mainly concerned with conceptual, historical, or methodological issues. An oral presentation may report on empirical research only if it is too complex for effective presentation in a poster (e.g., an integrated series of experiences). You may request 15 or 20 minutes for an oral presentation. These presentations are grouped by the Scientific Program Committee.

In this Congress only short articles should be submitted. Abstracts will not be accepted. Please see guidelines on the next page.

All papers, presentations and posters in the scientific program of the congress will be published in the *Congress Proceedings Book*.

Please read the following information carefully to ensure that your paper is acceptable for publication.

Only the *original copy* of the text will be suitable for the publisher. Fax copies of the manuscript cannot be accepted.

Please note that for your paper to be included in the program and in the Congress Proceedings Book, your registration payment must be received by the Congress Secretariat by May 15, 1997.

STYLE NOTES FOR AUTHORS

Instructions to the Typist:

 The original copy of the text only will be suitable for the publisher - fax copies cannot be accepted. Allow sufficient time for the mail service to deliver the manuscript to the Congress Secretariat.

- 2. The text will be printed as it appears on the copy received by the Congress Secretariat. Be sure to submit a camera ready copy.
- 3. Use white paper (A4) (21 x 29.7 cm) with 2.5 cm upper and side margins.
- 4. Paragraphs should be typed in single space, with a double space between each paragraph.

Style for authors:

<u>Text</u>: *Must be 3 pages maximum, including tables and references*. It is recommended to organize the text as follows:

(a) Key Words; (b) Introduction; (c) Method and Procedure; (d) Results; (e) Discussion and Conclusions; (g) References.

TITLE PAGE

The title will appear on the first page in capital letters followed in the next line by the author's name(s) and affiliation. Clearly indicate affiliations when authors come from different institutions.

MAJOR HEADING

Must be centered on the page in capital letters and not underlined. Leave a space of two lines before and after each major heading.

Subheadings

Use initial capitals for all main words, underlined and placed flush to the left-hand margin of the page. Leave a space of two lines before and after each subheading.

Sub-subheadings

Use a capital letter only for the first letter of the first word, underlined and positioned as for a normal paragraph, with the following text running on the same line.

Formulae, Mathematical Symbols, etc.

If equation symbols or Greek letters are not available on your computer or typewriter, write the symbols clearly in black ink. When mathematical expressions appear in the text requiring more space above or below the line, allow 2 spaces below the preceding and above the following line, or preferably it can be written as follows: A/B.

Figures, Tables, Illustrations

These should be *pasted* into position on the typed pages in the correct space between the typing. *Figures*: These must be drawn in black ink on the typed page, or in case of glossy photographs to be placed at the right place between the typed text. The title should be placed immediately after the figure and be preceded by "Fig. No." and followed by the figure title using capital letters for all main words (e.g., Fig. 1. Means and Standard Deviations of the Strategy Groups).

Tables: Table headings should appear centered above the table with the table number in Arabic numerals. The word "table" should be typed in capitals and underlined followed by the table heading using initial capital letters for all main words and underlined (e.g., <u>TABLE 5</u>. <u>Means and Standard Deviations</u>). Table notes should be placed directly below the table.

Illustrations: Glossy photographs are preferable. The title should be placed immediately after the illustration and be preceded by "Fig. No." and followed by the title using initial capital letters for all main words (e.g., Fig. 10. The Target Apparatus for Experiment 1). Photographs should be submitted in black and white only.

Footnotes

Footnotes should be separated from the text by a line across the page. The numbering should run consecutively through the paper and will not start at "1" on each page.

New Page

Each new page should start with a running title (running head) on the upper right hand line. Please write, <u>using a pencil</u>, your name and the page number in the upper right-hand corner of each page. The final page numbering will be done by the publisher.

References

References should be given in alphabetical order by author. The form of listed references is as follows:
