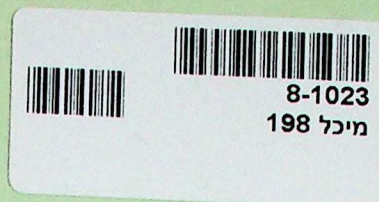

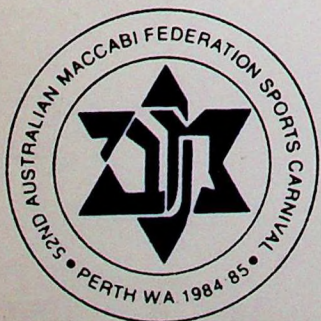

I am greatly honoured to have been invited to be the Patron for the 52nd Australian Maccabi Sports Carnival and extend a warm welcome to all visiting participants.

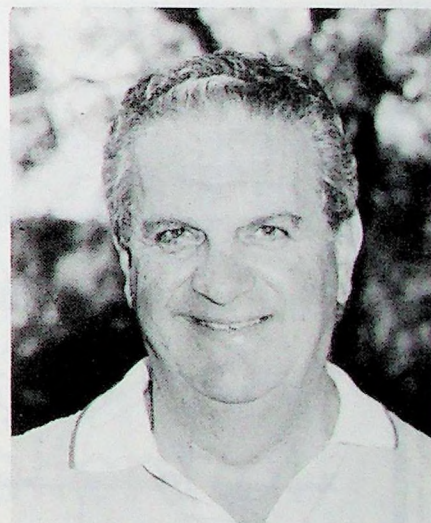

I am confident that you will all enjoy the friendly hospitality of the Perth community.

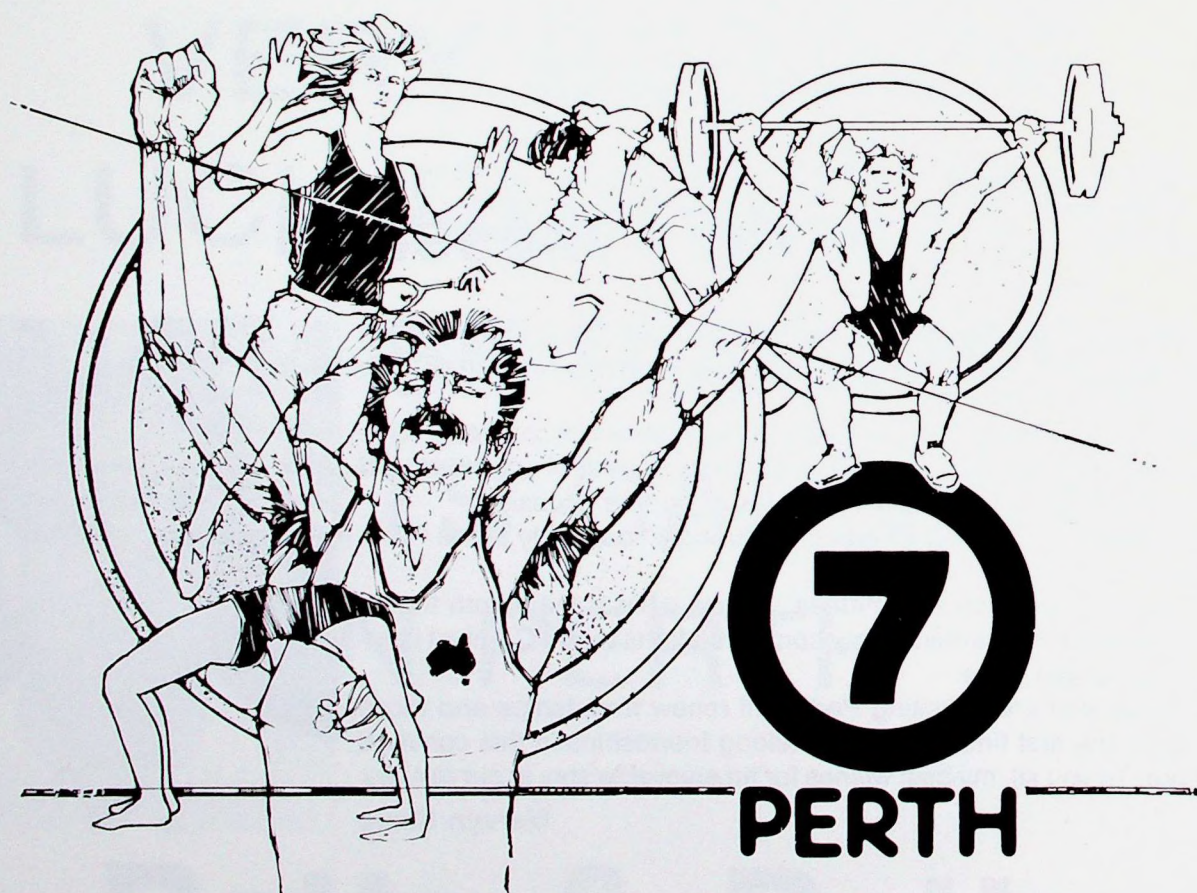
From my experience on committees, I know what a mammoth task it is to plan and organize carnivals; my congratulations to the Carnival committee on a job well done.

Although this is not my first time as Team Manager, I consider it to be a great honour and pleasure that I am able to lead such a large team at a home carnival that will compete in every sport contested.

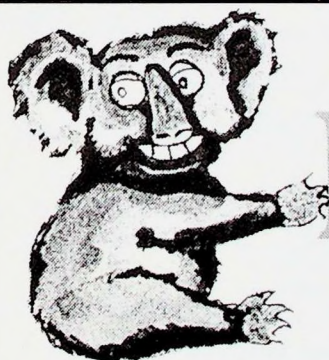

THE GEORGE MYERS MEMORIAL TORCH

The spirit and ideals of Maccabi Sports Carnivals is to promote understanding, comradeship and sportsmanship among the youth of Australia. No one person was a finer example of all these attributes than the late George Myers, and in the kindling of his torch, each year, we not only bridge the gap since George's death, but we reaffirm that these ideals still guide us in our endeavours.

The torch is 20 inches high and embodies the coat of arms of the five State members of the Australian Maccabi Federation. The lighting of the torch by the President of the A.M.F. signals the opening of each Carnival and when the torch is extinguished at the conclusion, it is handed over to the Team Manager who's State will be hosts of the next Carnival.

In this simple ceremony therefore we perpetuate the memory of a person who did so much for Jewish Sport and we ensure the perpetuation of our ideals with a flaming torch of fire.

MEMORIAL TO THE "ELEVEN"

On 30th December 1973, a memorial to the eleven Israeli athletes murdered at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich, was unveiled and dedicated at the Jewish Centre in Canberra. A chartered plane from Sydney carried 137 Carnival competitors and officials for the occasion.

The memorial was unveiled by the then President of the Australian Maccabi Council, Mr Joe Rosen, and speakers at the dedication included Sir Edgar Tanner, President of the Australian Olympic Federation, Rabbi Dr A. Fabian and the Ambassador of Israel Mr Moshe Erell. An Israeli athlete Yair Pantilat layed a wreath on behalf of all Israeli sportsmen.

The memorial plaque was commissioned by the A.M.C., and was designed and sculptured by Lou Rose in baked enamel and copper.

THE MACCABI TORCH

From Modi'in, the ancient burial ground of the Maccabees, comes the torch which will be used to light our own Carnival Torch to mark the opening of the 50th Australian Maccabi Sports Carnival.

The torch, a Chanuka gift from Maccabi World Union, is a replica of the torch used to light the flame at the last Maccabiah Games.

The torch has been used to light Chanuka candles in Perth, Adelaide, Melbourne and Sydney. Now bringing with it the spirit of the Maccabees, the torch from Modi'in signifies the close relationship between the Maccabi World Union and the Australian Maccabi Federation.

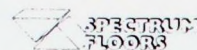

The Maccabiah Games' History

The Maccabiah Games which celebrate athletic achievement, were named after Judah Maccabeus, a Hebrew religious zealot (second century N.C.E.) who fought against the encroaching Hellenization of Jewish life symbolized by the Greek Olympic-style games and the cult of the physical.

However, Maccabeus, known as "the Hammer" because of his fighting skills, employed the physical for ultimately spiritual ends. His revolt against the occupying Syrian forces and their Hellenizing influence on the Jewish masses was the first recorded successful battle for religious freedom. The victory of Maccabeus and his band of zealots culminated in the recapture, cleansing and rededication of the Temple in Jerusalem on the 25th day of Kislev in 165 B.C.E., an event still commemorated in Jewish communities throughout the world on Hanukkah, the Festival of Lights.

In the late nineteenth century large numbers of Jews in Eastern Europe and the Middle East, suffering under religious oppression, turned to the development of their physical powers for their deliverance. Locked behind the wall of the ghetto, victimized by progroms, humbled, ridiculed and isolated from the outside world, they formed self-defense units and gymnastic clubs to rejuvenate the muscles of a people devoted for centuries to the study of the Talmud and Torah. They drew their model from the hero who had used his strength in the service of securing religious freedom; the Maccabi name was adopted by such athletic clubs in Constantinople by 1895-96. Austro-Hungary and Germany soon followed the Turkish example; supported by Zionist leaders Theodor Herzl and Max Nordau, the movement spread rapidly. Not all clubs took the Maccabi name. Some were called Bar Kochba, after another famed Hebrew warrior; others, Hakoah, the Hebrew word for "strength". On the eve of World War I more than 100 Maccabi-style clubs existed in Europe. Subsequent developments, however, were probably not what Judah Maccabeus would have envisioned or understood.

The World Maccabiah Games were the inspiration of Yosef Yekutieli who wanted to build a bridge between Jewish youth in the Diaspora and in Palestine. Born in Russia in 1897, Yekutieli settled in Palestine in 1908 and served in the Turkish army in 1917-18. He was the only delegate from Palestine to the Maccabi World Congress in 1929, where he suggested a convocation of Jewish athletes in Palestine. The idea was unanimously accepted and dates for the games to be held in Tel Aviv, were set for March 29-April 16, 1932.

Twenty-two nations and 390 athletes participated.

The stadium was completed the night before the opening of the Maccabiah. The crude oval was built to seat 5,000 spectators but 25,000 jammed in and thousands more were turned away. Athletes were housed in private homes as close to the stadium as possible.

Compare this to the 12th Maccabiah in 1981, when thirty three nations and approximately 3,450 athletes participated, surely nothing succeeds more than success.

Not surprisingly the Maccabiah Games, which eventually gained International Olympic Committee recognition, have seen more budding doctors, lawyers, engineers and other professional people participants than any other athletic festival in the world.

The Maccabiah, sometimes called the "Jewish Olympics", gave Americans, Spitz (1965), Ramenofsky (1961) and Weinberg (1973) their first taste of international competition.

Several innovations of the Maccabiah have subsequently been copied by the Olympics. Basketball was a Maccabiah sport before it appeared in the 1936 Berlin Olympics. A woman, Debra Turner-Markus, was the final torch bearer in the 1965 Maccabiah, three years before a female had the same honour at the Mexico City Olympics in 1968.

Maccabiah athletes who reside in and compete for one nation may compete for another when they change their residence. (This is not true of the Olympics). Thus Tal Brody, a member of the gold medal U.S.A. basketball team in 1965, led Israel to a 74-70 upset gold medal U.S.A. basketball team in 1965, led Israel to a 74-70 upset gold medal victory over America in the 1969 Maccabiah.

Track star Lorraine Lotzoff of South Africa, winner of the 100, 200 and 400 metres in 1965, met U.S.A. swimmer Richard Abramson at the Games that year. They were married and following motherhood she returned to Israel representing the U.S.A. in 1973. Mrs. Abramson captured a silver medal in the 200 and a bronze in the 100.

American David Berger, Maccabiah middleweight weightlifting gold medalist in 1969, made aliyah and representing Israel in the 1972 Olympics, was one of the eleven Israeli sportsmen slaughtered by Arab terrorists in Munich.

The 1935 Maccabiah was known as the "Aliyah Games." With war clouds approaching in Europe, Germany sent an inflated delegation of 134 athletes plus several large bands to Palestine. Other European nations did likewise, the athletes and "musicians" settling in Palestine rather than returning to their native lands.

The third Maccabiah was planned for 1938 but world events caused their cancellation. The Games were not resumed until 1950, this time in the newly created State of Israel, where they have since been staged.

It was in 1951, that Australia's participation began, with a team numbering 1 consisting of Elias Honig representing in tennis and reaching the quarter finals before being defeated by the eventual winner, South African champion and No. 1 Davis Cup player, Abe Segal. Honig settled in Israel and is currently the Director of Administration and Information at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

However, the warmth and excitement of participating upon "our soil" certainly spread as Australia has participated in every Maccabiah since and sent her largest contingent number 203 and participating in 17 sports to the 1981 Games.

Unfortunately our only names are currently mentioned in the Maccabiah record books, are those of Ivan Katz, featherweight 60 Kilogram weightlifter, whose snatch lift of 100 Kg. and total of 222.5 kg. was set in 1973, and in 1977 the swimming feat of Gillian Peters, swimming the 200 metre backstroke in 2.27.5 minutes.

Since 1957 the Games have been held on a four-year cycle, the year after the Olympics. An International Maccabiah Games Committee, was formed in 1963; it works closely with the Israel Organizing Committees for the Maccabiah.

In 1961, a memorial was held for nations that once had participated in the Maccabiah but whose Jewish communities had been wiped out in the Holocaust or were no longer able to compete. It was staged during Israel's bar mitzvah year and shortly after the traumatic experience of the Eichmann trial.

The memorial, in English, French, and Spanish as well as Hebrew was for Germany, Poland, Rumania, Czechoslovakia, Yugoslavia, Hungary, Bulgaria, Lithuania, Latvia, Egypt, Lebanon, Syria, Morocco and Libya.

The last official appearance by a Turkish delegation was in 1961. After this, under pressure from Arab nations, only Turkish Jewish observers were sent to Israel, each of them kissing Israel's soil after

arriving at Lod (Ben-Gurion Airport) and the soil at each athletic site.

The first and last appearance of an Iranian delegation was in 1965. Sixty thousand Israelis in Ramat Gan Stadium booed the bewildered Iranians and drove them to tears because, unknowingly, their goose-stepping march touched the raw nerves of many Holocaust survivors.

The cold silence which greeted the first West German delegation as they paraded with their nation's flag brought tears to the eyes of the athletes during the 1969 opening ceremonies. However, once the competition began the Germans were cheered by the crowds.

The 1969 trip of the delegations to the Western Wall of Tisha B'Av was doubly emotional. Not only was this their first visit to reunited Jerusalem but also, when the teams returned to their quarters on the outskirts of Tel Aviv from Jerusalem, it learned that Israeli jets had been in an intense battle with Egyptian MIG fighters over Suez that morning.

The colourfully turbanned delegations from India were always an attraction at the Games. After 1969, however, they ceased attending the Maccabiah because of the exodus of Jews from India and because of the restrictive policies of Indira Gandhi, who bowed to Arab pressures.

Emotional memorial services were held for the eleven Munich martyrs during the 1973 opening ceremonials.

Proud one-member teams have come from Zaire, Japan and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Considerable yiddishkeit envelops the Maccabiah Games, for they are much more than an athletic carnival. Jewish young people from around the world quickly find the thread that binds them together. The athletic aspect of the Games becomes secondary. Barriers of language and culture quickly dissolve under the blazing blue Israeli sky. Lasting friendships are made. There is an understanding and appreciation of one another as well as of the modern Maccabees of Israel. And underlying it all is a spiritual and religious awakening. What eventually emerges from each two-week Maccabiah experience is something that Judah Maccabeus would probably have loved after all.

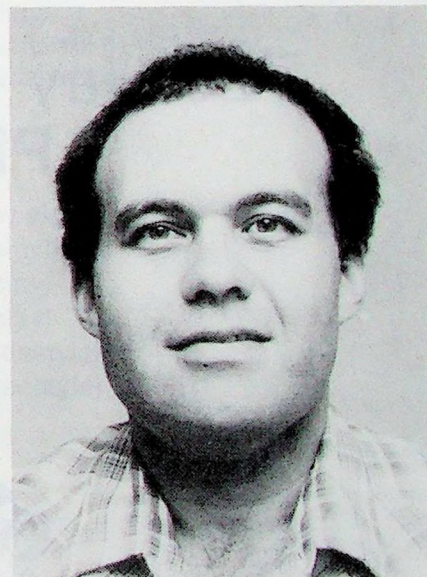
From a very young age, Ze'ev has been involved in Maccabi Tzair, holding many positions of leadership and has been responsible for educational programmes for youth leaders.

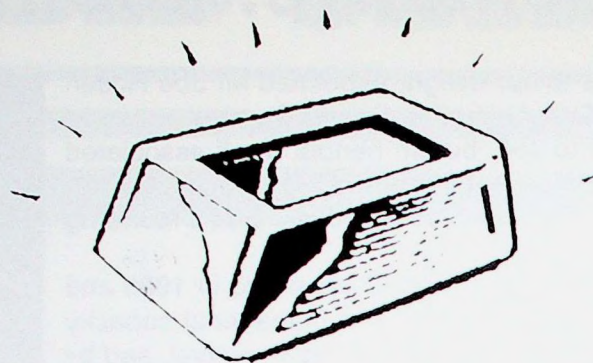

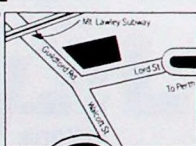
