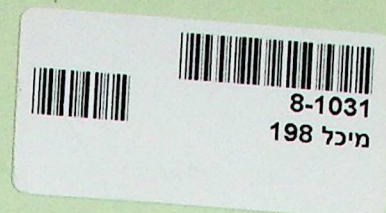

Munich Memorial



It was September 1972!

The eyes of millions of people the world over were focused on Munich!

Munich, the host city of the 20th Olympic Games, and like most countries of the world, Israel had made a big effort and sent 15 athletes to be represented at the "biggest show on earth".

I quote from the Maccabi News Bulletin of August 1972 — "Not that Israel has any illusions or great hopes about medals. We only hope that the athletes competing under the blue and white flag with the Star of David, will do their utmost to carry the colours in a decent and proud manner, in friendship and in the high ideals of the Olympic Games".

I need not dwell upon the ultimate massacre of 11 of the Israeli athletes.

It was decided by the Australian Maccabi Council, that a memorial in their honour should be erected at the National Jewish Centre in Canberra, and a dedication ceremony took place on 30th December, 1973.

Mr. Joe Rosen, the current President of the A.M.C. unveiled the memorial, and speakers included His Excellency, Mr. Moshe Erell, Ambassador for Israel, Sir Edgar Tanner, Chairman of the Olympic Federation of Australia, and Mr. Sid Hartstein, President of the National Jewish Memorial Centre. Rabbi Dr. Fabian dedicated the memorial and a wreath was layed by a visiting Israeli athlete, Yair Pantillat.

The memorial itself consists of a 6ft. by 4ft. wall sculpture in iron, copper and glazed enamel. The Olympic emblem is in black for mourning and shame. The 11 athletes are represented by 11 blood red Stars of David, while the burning bush denotes the belief that as the bush was never consumed, so the memory of the murdered athletes will never fade.

The Maccabi World Union has expressed its appreciation of this gesture, and in a letter of thanks from the President, Dr. I. Peled, he says — "Let the Maccabi Movement and its sporting ideals be a reservoir and a rear base of the part of the Nation, fighting for its existence in Zion, and for the future of Israel and the whole Jewish People".

A.M.F. PRESIDENT'S REPORT



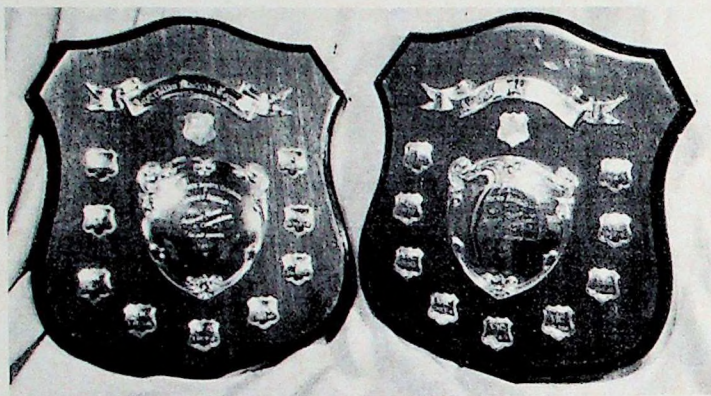

The buildings of Montsalvat, with their use of mud brick and natural materials, has, in fact, influenced the architecture of Eltham. The grounds of Montsalvat, with swimming pool, allow the natural beauty of the district to be inhaled and thenceforward never to be forgotten.
