My brothers, the Leaders of Maccabi in the Diaspora,

In this country we were the first - and for more than a generation the only ones - who furthered the idea of body culture amongst the Jewish youth, who taught National values without supporting hard line ideologies, who straightened the back-bone of the People, who provided the framework for military training and the preparation of Jewish strength in the period before the establishment of the Haganah and the other underground organizations.

Maccabi founded all the sports Federations, including the Olympic Committee, and for many years lead these bodies, just as we were the first to represent the State of Israel in the International Sports' Arena for many years in spite of the plots of a foreign regime and in spite of formal and other difficulties we proudly carried the Blue and White flag of a Nation as yet unrecognized by the International Communities.

Now we are no longer alone. We are not even the largest Movement numerically, but we stick to our tradition, our values and our principles and prove that the spirit of the Maccabees beats in our ranks and we continue to preserve the crown of quality within all fields of our activity.

114 branches of Maccabi, together with the Maccabi Youth Movement and the Maccabi Order (Veterans of the Movement), include a total of 40,000 members; and constitute a united and glorious force, while hundreds of thousands of citizens of Israel follow and support every appearance of Maccabi teams.



We are proud of our sporting achievements during the last year in all fields:

1. Maccabi Tel Aviv was crowned for the Second time as Asian Champions.
2. Maccabi Natanya won the National Football League.
3. Maccabi Tel Aviv won the National Cup in the Basketball League for the eleventh time whilst Maccabi Haifa took second place in the National Cup and will represent Basketball in the International arena, in the European Championships for Cup Holders.
4. The Maccabi Tel Aviv Women's Team has also been successful and has won the National League at the same time as winning the Cup.

We will show you a sample of our activities, and I hope that the little that you will see will convince you that, in spite of the lack of resources and the policy of strengthening the strong and weakening the weak, we continue to carry out our task and that the potential in Maccabi in Israel is encouraging and holds good for the future.

In the fourteen other branches of sport in which we are active we have also made achievements in standards, some of which are: Winning the National Tennis League; First Place in the Athletics League; The National Championship for Handball - Women's Team; 5 National Championships in Boxing; Israeli Record Holders in swimming by Maccabi members; amongst them Doritz Zaltz, Israel Champion in the Crawl Stroke. Israel Fencing Champions are the Elin brothers of Ramat Gan.



You are probably concerned that Maccabi members from abroad should be absorbed in our Federation in Israel and that they should find with us a framework - both sporting and social - for continuing the activity within Maccabi. I am not able to state that the equipment and framework exist to ensure such absorption, and if you will all give your opinions on this point, then you will see with pride and satisfaction the members of Maccabi from the Diaspora who continue the chain which began 75 years ago.

I greet you and hope that your visit to our country will add a further stage to the closing of the link between the various sections of the Movement and the focal point of the World Movement - Maccabi Israel.

## A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE ORGANIZATION OF MACCABI ISRAEL

The diagram on the opposite page illustrates the organizational structure of Maccabi Israel. Every three years, following elections, the National Conference convenes, it establishes the policy of the Movement for the ensuing three years, elects a National Council of Approx. 120 members and the latter acts as Supervisory Body over the Executive Board. The National Conference also elects a President and nominates the chairman of the Council.

\* \* \* \* \*

The Council convenes immediately after the Conference elects its chairman and an Executive Board (12-14 members) and nominates (sometimes elects) the Chairman of the Executive. All members of the Executive, including the chairman, are picked from amongst the members of the Council. Except for the constitutional meeting, which follows the Conference, the Council meets on the initiative of the Executive Board to discuss problems of principle, including approval of budget.

\* \* \* \* \*

The Executive Board consists of 14 members responsible for defined 14 portfolios. This convenes every week, administers the budget and deals with all current affairs of the movement.

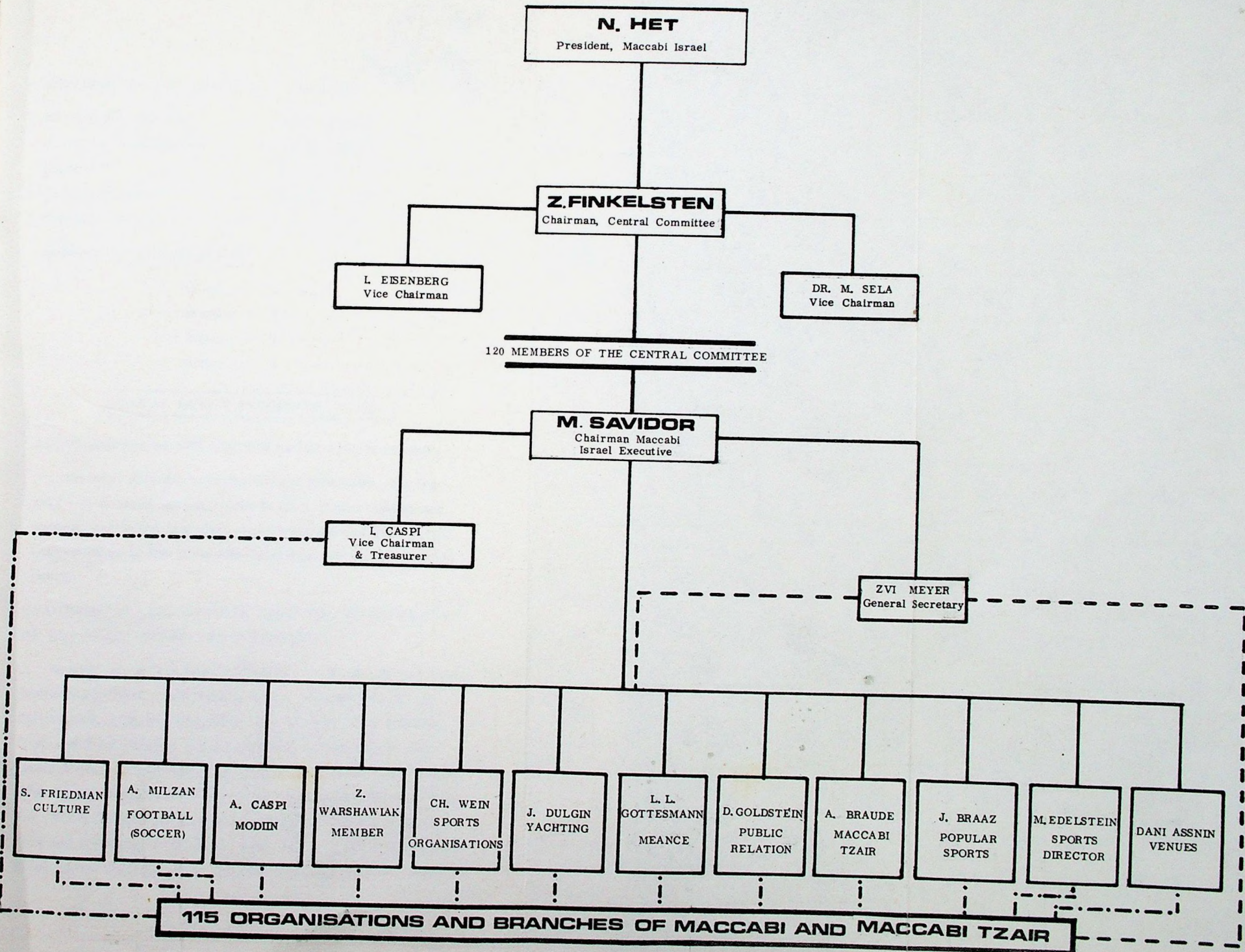
The Executive Secretary is responsible for carrying into effect all decisions of the Executive Board and for the follow up of the functioning of all national venues-committees and branches.

The Chairmen of the branches report directly to the Chairman of the Executive Board and/or to the respective Board Members (in the areas of their direct responsibility).

During the year a combined or separate meeting of members of the National Council and chairmen of branches take place to discuss problems of major importance if such arise.

Tel Aviv Maccabi were the League champions, and travelled to Rumania for international track meets. Ladani and Pantilat won races overseas, while victories and good results were attained in the Israel Championships and in all the relay races.

Maccabi sportsmen have participated in all the National and International track meets held in Israel, and Maccabi is well represented in all the National teams. In 1960, Yair Pantilat from Tel Aviv Maccabi was nominated Sportsman of the Year. Deborah Marcus was chosen as Sportswoman of the Year in 1966 after having won a Gold Medal at the Asian Games held in Bangkok. Games in Mexico. He holds all the Israeli records for all distances. In the Olympic Games in Rome in 1960, 5 of the 8 athletes in the Israeli squad were Maccabi members and the trainer was Mr. A. Green also of Maccabi.

#### BRIEF SURVEY OF THE SECTION AND ITS PROGRESS

Athletics was one of the basic sports in the Maccabi movement, and together with Gymnastics, was recognized as the elementary and rudimentary branch of sport. The Athletics branch was established even before 1930, and from then until the establishment of the State, Maccabi have led the field. However, since the establishment of the State, the Athletics branch has developed immensely in "Hapoel" thanks to the funds at their disposal, but Maccabi has not lagged behind and has been honourably represented in all the tournaments. This was particularly apparent in the 1960 Olympic Games held in Rome when 5 of the members of the Olympic team were Maccabi members.

During the next decade the framework must be enlarged existing clubs must be developed, the budget, which is relatively small for the prime Olympic sport and has many requirements, must be increased, the training standards must be raised, equipment must be purchased, more courses should be organized, in addition to more National and International tournaments, and finally, facilities and tracks must be improved.

The Clubs operating in Maccabi are:

Tel Aviv Maccabi, Bat Yam Maccabi, Jerusalem Maccabi, Ramat Gan Maccabi, Ramat Chen Maccabi, Haifa Maccabi and Netanya Maccabi.

The challenges we face today are:

The Maccabi Games, the Olympic Games, the Asian Games, the Maccabi Track Meet, the National and International Tournaments.

## FOUNDED IN 1930

The basketball section of Maccabi began to develop in 1940 when the two teams, Tel Aviv Maccabi and Brit Maccabim Atid, were regarded as the strongest teams in the country.

The visits of Maccabi to Cairo in 1946-1947 served as an incentive for basketball, and with the establishment of the State and the waves of immigration, many clubs began playing basketball and several youth teams were organized and numerous events were held.

The Maccabi teams have always been known to maintain their high standard, and every year a Maccabi team has won either the National Championships or the Cup or both. The Maccabi teams have also served as the major source for players in the Israel Basketball team.

## As for facilities:

A number of teams play on fields belonging to others, while some teams play on underdeveloped grounds and the top teams have not got modern fields, so that most of the main, important games have to be played on fields belonging to other clubs.

## BRIEF SURVEY OF THE SECTION AND ITS PROGRESS

The boxing section was established in 1924 after the First World War, by a Jew from Manchester, a soldier by the name of Cod Louis. Training sessions were held in the gymnasium of the old Herzlia High School. In 1926, the first tournament was held at the "Eden" cinema in Tel Aviv. During this period,



Tel Aviv Maccabi, whose trainer was Avizeri Amiel, boxed against the Jaffa Orthodox Club in the gymnasium of the French Hospital in Jaffa, and Mr. Avizeri Amiel fought the British Navy Champion in Ramle in 1926 in the presence of the High Commissioner for Palestine, Lord Plumer. In 1925, the "Benn: Leonard" Club was founded and managed by Amiel Avizeri. In 1927, a boxing tournament between Jews and British was held in the Rina Park. The result was 4:4 in spite of the fact that all the referees were British. Generally speaking, boxing in Palestine had many highlights throughout this period.

#### THE FUTURE

The boxers are about to leave for a month's tour in Switzerland, Holland, England and Norway. Of the 12 boxers participating in this tour 7-8 are Maccabi members. During the months November-December 1971, 5 countries will take part in a tournament to be held at the Yad Eliahu Sports Stadium.

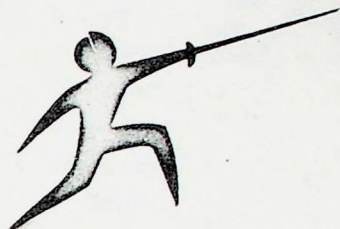

The Youth and Senior teams won both the Asian Championship and Cup. Tel Aviv Maccabi, which participated in the Championships, has returned home twice with the Asian Cup.

During the last two years, Israel has added a glorious new chapter to its international football annals, having been amongst the 16 countries eligible for participation in both the World Cup and the Olympic Games in Mexico. The games against Italy and Sweden, both professional and both famous teams in world football, ended in draws. These results came as a surprise and caused a sensation the world over, and Israel was showered with praise.

#### WHAT IS MACCABI'S SHARE IN ISRAELI FOOTBALL?

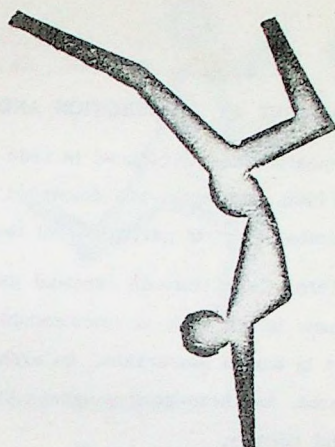
Where does it stand, how does it influence the sport and what is its significance? One could say that football in Maccabi today, in the 'Seventies, is carrying on its outstanding tradition which originated in the 'Thirties, long before the War of Independence, when the "Hashmonaim" team of Jerusalem Maccabi was in a class of its own when it came to football, as it possessed technique, polish, fighting spirit and had a high standard and was entertaining to watch. Suffice it to mention, for example, that since the War of Independence and the establishment of the State, Maccabi teams have won the National Championships on 11 occasions and have also won the State Cup 11 times out of 16 within this framework.

In recent years, two footballers, Mordechai Spiegler and Giora Spiegel who are members of Maccabi teams, have become extremely popular with the public, and Netanya Maccabi and Tel Aviv Maccabi attract the largest crowds to the football grounds. Maccabi players are also the majority in both the senior and youth National teams.

The intensive work in Maccabi football is all carried out on a purely voluntary basis, both in the associations and the central body. The National Football Committee comprises a group of people nominated by the Management of Israel Maccabi for fixed periods. The Committee meets once a week because of the numerous and varied problems brought before it.

During the last few years, Maccabi has expanded and clubs have been established in development towns in the South, the Negev and the Galilee. New teams which have been organised in immigrant settlements are well established and are even ascending the league ladders.

## BRIEF SURVEY OF THE SECTION AND ITS PROGRESS

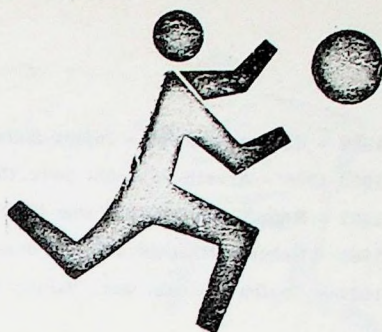
Gymnastics was introduced in 1950 at the Kiryat Bialik Maccabi club. The sport has developed well during the years and a number of girls participate at the National level.

In 1970, Haifa Maccabi renewed its activity and the progress made in this club is commendable. A club was also established in Kiryat Shmaryahu, an area populated mainly by new immigrants, and here good progress has also been made since the initial activity.

We have achieved our aim of adding physical training teachers of which there is such a shortage in the country. At Kiryat Bialik pupils register annually for the Wingate Institute, and they, therefore, ensure progress in this sport.

Facilities: Gymnasiums at Haifa Maccabi and Har Hacarmel Maccabi. In all the other places, gymnastics is practiced in the halls of the Local Councils.

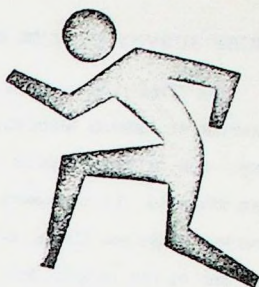

#### BRIEF SURVEY OF THE SECTION AND ITS PROGRESS

Handball started its development in Maccabi in 1933 at the time of the influx of immigrants from Germany. Petah Tikva Maccabi, who were already playing handball then, were the leading team in the country. During the Second World War and the War of Independence regular activity came to a halt, but after the establishment of the State Rehovot Maccabi topped the League in handball. Rishon Lezion Maccabi and Tsafon Maccabi joined the ranks of the leading handball teams during this period. At the beginning of the 'Sixties, 7-player handball was introduced and even then Maccabi teams led the field. Tsafon Maccabi won the Cup, Ramat Gan Maccabi were the Women Champions.

The International handball debut was made by Rehovot Maccabi in 1954 when it left to play against a team in Holland. In 1959, a selected Maccabi team played in the European Maccabi Games in Denmark, and in 1968 the Israel Maccabi team conducted a successful tour in Europe. During all these years, Maccabi was well presented in the various National teams. Mr. M. Rash trained the National team between 1966-69, and at present Mr. Sammy Nissan of Arazim Maccabi is the trainer of the National Women's team.

## BRIEF SURVEY OF THE SECTION AND ITS PROGRESS

The first judo club in Maccabi was established by Yehuda Vasdias at Ashdod Maccabi. The club functioned for only a short time, and in 1965 Yehuda started organizing his club at Ramat Gan Maccabi. Three years ago a large modern building was erected in Ramat Chen, and it is the best judo club in Maccabi and one of the largest and most attractive clubs in Israel.

Further progress was made in Rishon Lezion and Rehovot during the last three years. In Rishon Lezion a special judo hall was built, and serves as a centre for the entire area. This was built less than a year ago, and all the facilities have still to be installed so that it can fulfill its purpose. The youngest club, which is in Ra'anana, was established a few months ago, and two teams have been organized. Most of the initiative for development stems from the Rishon Lezion Judo club, and particularly the heads of the club, Leopold Werner and Yosef Lev who are interested in expanding the branch and introducing it to all the Maccabi clubs in the country. Youngsters have been sent to Junior Judo Instructors Courses, and we already have 9 instructors, some of whom will be able to start instructing and spreading this new Olympic sport. The Judo committee was established six months ago, and the first Children and Youth Championships were held recently. We hope to make this a regular event.

## BRIEF SURVEY OF THE SECTION AND ITS PROGRESS

The "Zevulun" Seaman's Association was founded in 1928. The aim of the Association was to instill a seafaring consciousness in the youth, and to provide a generation of Israeli seamen. The Association developed steadily, and in the 1930's "Zevulun" graduates were accepted for employment on the ships "Tel Aviv", "Har Zion" and "Har Carmel". During the second world war, members of "Zevulun" joined the British Navy. Since the end of the first course conducted by "Zevulun", there has not been one branch of Israeli seamanship in which the graduates of the Association were not the pioneering element. The Engineer, the late A. Tovim, devoted his time and energy to the development of Zevulun since the inception of the Association, and it was he who dedicated most of his time and thought to the development of Hebrew seamanship in general. The late Mrs. Henrietta Diamond donated substantial sums of money to "Zevulun", and one of her sons, the renowned British judge Seigmond Diamond, has taken an interest in the activities of the Association and the Management of "Zevulun" maintains contact with him.

The Association has 8 clubs in Israel: Haifa, Hadera, Netanya, Herzlia, Tel Aviv, Jaffa, Bat Yam and Ashdod.

Aims of the Association for the future: Seamanship instruction for Youth and Adults; Establishment of new clubs; Holding regular sailing and swimming events; Training sails and visits along the Israel coast and abroad; Purchase of new sailing equipment; Obtaining a regular allocation of funds from the Government, various institutions and from private contributors for the financing of the Association's activities.

In the existing clubs the competitors sail in boats of the following classes: "420", Flying Dutchman, Caravelle.

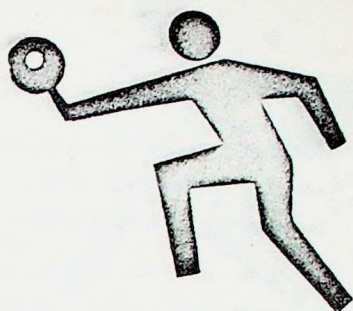

#### BRIEF SURVEY OF THE SECTION AND ITS PROGRESS:

The section was established in 1930.

Until a year ago the Maccabi associations had no facilities whatsoever of their own. All the training took place in hired pools and this hampered the progress of swimming in Maccabi. Only last year the Haifa Maccabi Association was awarded a pool of its own.

Some of the associations participating in the swimming, particularly the larger ones - Brit Maccabim Atid and Haifa Maccabi, are striving to expand their scope and to build pools of their own which would be placed at the disposal of swimmers during all hours of the day, thus making for substantial progress in swimming. Maccabi has only two water polo teams. However, Brit Maccabim Atid has been one of the leading teams for many years, and two years ago in 1969, it won the State Cup. Haifa Maccabi which in the past was the leading light of this section, was disbanded and reorganized only last year.

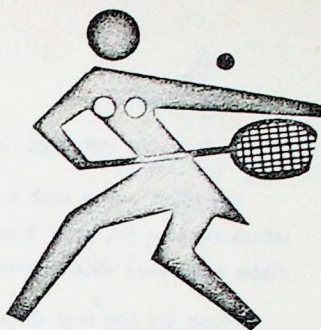

## BRIEF SURVEY OF THE SECTION AND ITS PROGRESS

Table Tennis, which is usually a modest section, has reached the headlines of the world press after the friendly matches played between China and the United States.

In the past, we in Israel have also experienced great days of international meetings when we played against countries such as Yugoslavia and Bulgaria. Maccabi Hatzafon, which is Israel's representative team, has toured Europe and attained great achievement in Belgium, Holland and France. The National Committee is at present making every effort to develop this sport amongst the Youth, and one can already mention the partial success in this field as a result of the accomplishments of Zichron Yaakov Maccabi which is not a club situated in the center of the country. At Zichron Yaakov a team of boys was created and enormously promising talent was discovered. The Committee intends to invite a coach from abroad and to increase the number of competitions so as to provide the young players with experience. Much to our disappointment, it ought to be mentioned that apart from the world championships our players do not have any opportunity to compete in the international field. This will be rectified in the future, and next year an Israel Maccabi team will participate in games in Europe at the invitation of various teams.

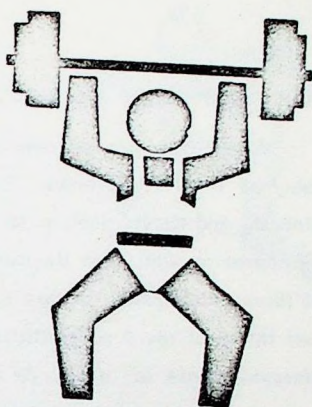

Weightlifting was introduced in 1968 in Tel Aviv Maccabi. In the year 1969/70 the teams Shimshon Netanya Maccabi, Haifa Maccabi and Kiryat Shalom Maccabi were added. Wrestling was introduced to Maccabi in 1968, and Tel Aviv Maccabi managed to defeat the Israel Champions, Tel Aviv Hapoel in its first season in the league. ## NATIONAL EVENTS AND COURSES OF "YOUNG MACCABI"

**SUCCOT** - During the Succot holidays, "Young Maccabi" holds a national camp for all the members of the movement. The camp lasts for 4 days and is devoted to camping activities, sport, entertainment and field-craft.

**HANUKA** - The Torch Race - An event which has taken place annually for 25 years. The torch is lit at dawn at the graves of the Maccabees at Modiin, and is carried by thousands of runners, members of "Young Maccabi" and Maccabi sportsmen, throughout the entire country to the Israeli Army lines and finally to the House of Parliament, the home of the President and the Wailing Wall.

## NATIONAL COUNCIL

Every second year, "Young Maccabi" holds its national convention which is called the National Council. The Council determines the activities of the movement for the following two years, and has elections for the various institutions.

**ADAR** - Pilgrimage to Tel Hai, a traditional hike through the Galilee ending with a mass parade at the graves of the heroes of Tel Hai.

**PURIM** - devoted to parties and carnivals at the clubs.

NISSAN - Pilgrimage to Massada - a hike intended for the senior groups, which takes place in the Judean Desert. During the hike, the participants climb the Massada Mountains in memory of the heroes of Massada, and repeat the motto: "Massada shall not fall again."

During the Pesach holidays, a preparatory course is held for those attending the Instructors' Course in the summer. Another course is also held for sports instructors who afterwards conduct the sports activities in the clubs.

SHAVUOT - a hike or camp for the junior groups. The destination of the hike varies from year to year.

SUMMER - An instructors course lasting for 30 days is held, and the instructors are trained to handle the clubs. They receive instruction on the fundamentals of leadership, sport, camping, entertainment, first aid, Maccabism, field craft and many other topics which they transmit thereafter to their members at the clubs.

Summer camps are also held at the clubs, and some clubs go to work camps on kibbutzim.

Club, regional and national sports days are held during the year, as well as monthly courses for instructors, hikes and regional camps.

#### BRIEF SURVEY OF "YOUNG MACCABI" AND ITS PROGRESS

At the Maccabi Conference convened in Palestine in 1933, it was decided to organize the Maccabi youth within the framework of "Young Maccabi". During the years, the movement started to organize within the framework of the various Maccabi associations throughout the country, with a motto "A Healthy Mind in a Healthy Body" carried on its banner.

"Young Maccabi" combined educational and scout activities, such as camping, field craft and study with sport. The "Young Maccabi" movement educates its members towards good citizenship and pioneering activity in all walks of life. When the national challenge was the settlement of Palestine, the "Young Maccabi" Movement established Kfar Hamaccabi, Ma'Ayan Zvi, Mezuba, Kfar Ruppin and Hasollelim



The challenge facing the movement today are the expansion of its membership and the creation of a situation in which there will be a Young Maccabi club attached to every Maccabi Association in Israel, as well as the absorption of Maccabi sportsmen up to the age of 18 into the ranks of the Zionist Educational youth movement - "Young Maccabi".

The challenge of immigrant absorption is also faced today by the Young Maccabi movement, and for this purpose an Absorption Committee has been attached to the board. The Committee is to be responsible for contacting new immigrants, assisting their integration and renewing the contact with Maccabi members who have immigrated to Israel.
