

JEWISH SPORT IN AUSTRALIA

Although organised Jewish amateur sport existed in Western Australia, New South Wales and Victoria since around 1880, it was not until the early 1920s, with the formal establishment of Jewish sporting clubs, that it began to flourish with significant numbers of people becoming involved in a range of sports.

Jewish sporting activities in NSW, Victoria and Western Australia revolved around a number of organisations which assumed a variety of names and were increasingly popular, with strong membership bases. With activities booming in the three centres it was inevitable that interstate contests would not be very far behind.

The initiative came from the Sydney Judean Amateur Athletic Association, which fielded a cricket team in regular open competition and made contact with the community in Melbourne in the hope of organising a tour of Victoria. Thus it was, that with the 1924 arrival in Melbourne of a group of enthusiastic cricketers from NSW for a seven day tour, the long tradition of interstate Jewish sporting competitions was begun. This was the first time in the history of Australian Jewry that representatives of two communities met on the sporting field and had close social contact with their fellow Jews from interstate.

As with many other worthwhile traditions, the beginnings were modest, but it was from this gathering of cricket enthusiasts that Interstate Carnivals were born. Carnivals now feature more than 20 sports, with participants from all of the states with Jewish communities, as well as from overseas, numbering more than 500 each year.

FOOTLOOSE AND FANCY FREE - THE SPIRIT OF THE CARNIVALS

Carnival! The very word exudes a spirit of wonderful days and nights. Crazy, convivial, carefree capers. Colourful, concentrated, combative contests. Classless, cluttered, colossal Carnivals!

The Carnival has annually brought together large numbers of individuals who, by their interest in getting involved, have created a marvellous spirit that has permeated the whole Jewish community. No other activity in our Australian Jewish life brings together all sections of the community - young and old, sporting participants and passive onlookers, rabbonim and rationalists. Two Carnivals are conducted every year - one is for juniors, the other for open and masters' age groups.

Official Interstate Carnivals have now reached 60 in number and have been held in Perth, Adelaide, Melbourne, Sydney, Brisbane and on the Gold Coast. Junior Carnivals have been conducted 11 times and have been hosted by every mainland state capital city.

The social aspect of Carnivals is undoubtedly vital. Friendships established are legendary and long lasting, romantic games the only ones never called off due to bad light or inclement weather.

Carnivals have also provided magnificent training in leadership, planning and responsibility. It would be hard to name a Jewish communal leader, academic, professional, or business identity anywhere in Australia who has not played a part in Maccabi's history.

Going From Strength To Strength: Maccabi Australia Incorporated

Maccabi Australia Incorporated (MAI) is the roof body for all Jewish sporting organisations in our country.

As Australian Jewry's largest grassroots organisation, its principal aim is to promote Jewish identity through sporting, cultural, Zionist and social activities.

The network of responsibilities is all encompassing - MAI organises international teams, conducts annual junior and senior interstate sporting carnivals, holds leadership and training seminars, participates in Zionist activities, monitors the day-to-day functioning of its affiliates and co-ordinates its programs with other Jewish organisations in the community.

MAI is also an active member of the Zionist Federation of Australia and the Executive Council of Australian Jewry.

Administrative work is carried out by an elected group of volunteers who devote their time to achieving the goal of promoting Jewish identity.

Maccabi's national roof body was established in 1957 as the Australian Judean Sports Council. Its name has since changed first to Australian Maccabi Council, then to the current Maccabi Australia Incorporated in 1991. This latest change was more significant than a mere alteration to wording, as it initiated a new direction in administration.

MAI is now effectively run by an Australia wide executive with five committees covering the areas of senior sport, junior sport, international activities, finance, and culture and public relations. These committees set policies and guide the movement through its activities.

With constituent organisations in Western Australia, South Australia, Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland, MAI is affiliated with the Maccabi World Union and the Australian Sports Foundation. The affiliates conduct Maccabi activities in their respective areas of jurisdiction with more than 5000 members involved in a full range of sporting and cultural events on a regular basis.

The World Zionist Organisation and the Maccabi World Union are just two of the major organisations which have publicly recognised the excellent work of MAI in fostering Jewish identity and strengthening links with Israel. MAI actively promotes the concept of Israel's centrality in Jewish life. Last year, in conjunction with the Jewish National Fund of Australia, it was decided to establish a Maccabi Australia Forest in Israel. Every competitor attending Interstate Carnivals in Australia or the Maccabiah Games will have a tree planted in his or her name in Israel. This project is a cause of immense pride for all members of the Australian Maccabi movement.

NSW MACCABI BASKETBALL CLUB

After a few difficult years basketball is once again well on the way to becoming one of the main strengths of the Maccabi movement in NSW.

With 150 members on its books in 1994, the club fielded nine junior teams in the City of Sydney Basketball Association's competitions, with the way open for the cream of this "crop" to go on to representative honours with the Sydney Comets.

Teams competing under the Maccabi banner at the moment are one Under 18 team, three Under 16, two Under 14 and one Under 12 boys' teams, as well as two Under 16 girls' squads. A senior women's and two veteran men's teams make up Maccabi's basketball presence in the City of Sydney competition.

In the years prior to 1994 Maccabi teams generally only appeared in various junior carnivals.

The club also made an impression on the international scene, with **Adam Berger** and **Marissa Ely** gaining representative honours with the Australian Maccabi team which competed at the North American Maccabi Youth Games in Cleveland, Ohio, last August.

A highlight of the Maccabi basketball year is the reinstituted annual **Reebok Challenge** against Victoria Maccabi on the June Queen's Birthday Weekend.

Independent coaches are in control of all Maccabi basketball teams and plans call for the appointment in 1995 of a Director of Coaching with overall responsibility for all of the club's teams.

A major tool the club utilises in attracting aspiring Jewish junior basketball players to its ranks is the annual **Sydney Kings Coaching Clinic**, which attracted a bumper crowd of 100 youngsters in 1994.

NORTHSIDE MACCABI JUNIOR TENNIS CLUB

Despite the problems associated with securing suitable home courts, Northside Maccabi Tennis Club can look back on a successful year in 1994.

Nine teams were entered in the Hornsby/Killara competition and for the first time weekly practice sessions were organised, where most of the teams met and played under the watchful gaze of the club's new professional coach Tanya Cohen.

Regular practice, coupled with the commitment of the players and their dedicated parents, resulted in an outstanding campaign - eight teams reaching their semi finals, six the finals and three ending the season as Divisional champions.

Undisputed club camps were Sean Schapiro, member of the club's top boys' team, and his sister Alexi, who plays with the girls' second team.

Both won their divisional singles titles and were members of winning teams.

Another outstanding player was Darren Schneider of the boy's second team, who won his divisional singles title.

Club awards for 1993 went to Marc Langbart and David Jacobs (Sportsmanship), Farrel Brest (Most Improved), Shaun Steingold, Steven Cohen, Darren Schneider and Farrel Brest (Most Enthusiastic Team) and Alexi Schapiro, Lee Friedman, Debby Levien and Nicola Gafen (Best and Fairest Team).

An exciting new development is the entry of eight Northside Maccabi teams into a new four division Oxford Falls Sunday competition during the winter season traditionally dominated by soccer and netball.

The club's teams make up a quarter of the entries in this new league.

To cater for the increasing interest in Jewish junior tennis on the North Shore, the club has launched another innovative new program, its Maccsquads - evening groups of six youngsters matched as closely as possible in skill levels.

Purpose of the scheme is to maintain and improve the skill levels of summer and winter competition players, or, in fact, any child of any standard interested in regular weekly tennis activity.

That the program is successful was proven at Junior Interstate Carnival time, with half of the Carnival age members of Northside Maccabi signing up for NSW and participating in the competition in Melbourne last January.

Much has been achieved, but much still lies ahead for this ambitious club in its burgeoning development program - Macteenies, weekend camps and clinics among them.

Indeed, the sky seems to be the limit.

NORTHSIDE MACCABI NETBALL CLUB

Northside Maccabi Netball Club registered a total of 22 teams for the Ku-ring-gai competition in 1994, with two of them, the Under 11A and the Under 10B squads winning their grand finals.

Altogether, seven teams reached the semi-finals, with five going on to the grand finals. It is worth noting that the victorious Under 11A side pulled off a magnificent double with its premiership success, the same squad of girls having won the Under 10A grand final a year earlier.

In other competitive efforts, teams were entered in the Eastwood Ryde Carnival.

Five Northside Maccabi girls caught the eyes of district selectors, who invited them to join the Ku-ring-gai Association's Under 11 Skills Squad. They were **Rebecca Levy, Lana Ross, Nola Melamet, Steffi Klaest and Lisa Canard.**

The Ku-ring-gai Netball Association train on squad for 1995 boasts seven Maccabi players in **Laura Ross, Nola Melamet, Lisa Canard, Joanne Been, Julie Stern** (Under 12), **Lauren Milner** (Under 13) and **Taryn Sacks** (Under 14).

In an endorsement of the success of the club, **Northside Maccabi Netball Club** was awarded the **Australian Jewish News Maccabi Club of the Year Trophy** for 1994.

Northside Maccabi also plays a vital part in the important activity of umpire education, with 15 of the girls graded as Low District D umpires, five as Mid D and three as High D.

The previous year, in 1993, the club also entered 22 teams, with four of them reaching the Ku-ring-gai Association grand finals - both the Under 10A and the Under 10B team winning the premiership.

In Under 10C and Cadets 3 grades Northside Maccabi finished runners-up, the two teams losing their grand finals by just one and nine goals respectively.

The Under 10A squad's success was the first time ever that the club has won an A grade championship.

It was also another good year for Northside in representative selections, with **Lauren Milner** picked for the Ku-ring-gai Under 11 Talent Squad, **Taryn Sacks** making the district's Under 12 representative squad and **Jane Zurnamer** joining the Under 12/13 train on squad.

Northside Maccabi entered teams in the Curl Curl and City of Sydney Carnivals, taking good advantage of the extra opportunities for competition provided by these popular events.

In umpiring activities a number of Northside Maccabi members gained their badges in 1993, including **Dina Moss, Alana Fisher, Kate Freedman, Stacey Milner, Lara Abelson** (Low D), **Karene Gluckman, Kerry Hyde** and **Nicola Shaffer** (Mid D). **Kerry Hyde** was later promoted to High D.

Altogether 34 Northside Maccabi girls wrote the umpires' examination in 1993, with 24 recording outstanding success with their efforts.

MACCABI HAKOAH SOCCER CLUB

Traditional post-Maccabiah Games problems once again bedevilled Maccabi Hakoah Soccer Club's season in 1994.

The major exertion involved in a quadrennial Maccabiah Games effort always seems to precipitate retirements and an outflow of players seeking success at higher levels than what the club offers the following season - and 1994 was not different from past campaigns.

A tough environment, caused by further cuts in funding, made for a difficult year. However, notwithstanding these problems, the club still sought the appointment of a top class, experienced coach, vitally important when competing at a high level, and particularly valuable when trying to attract new players, at the same time retaining the quality campaigners on Maccabi Hakoah's books.

Five teams were fielded in 1994, catering for a wide range of requirements among the players, from the highly competitive environment of the NSW Soccer Federation's Second Division - the highest level of competition by any member club of NSW Maccabi - to social soccer played in a Sunday League in the Eastern Suburbs.

In the social and fundraising arena, Maccabi Hakoah worked hard to reduce the shortfall in finances caused by the funding cuts by arranging a number of functions, such as "Old Boys" games, theatre nights and other similar activities.

The club also tried to bolster its playing ranks and worked hard to keep in touch with the many talented players on the Jewish soccer circuit by organising and hosting a competition between teams representing Moriah, Masada and the Emanuel Schools and Maccabi.

Played in great spirit and with much enthusiasm, Maccabi won in a penalty shootout a tournament which showcased the outstanding up and coming young soccer talent in the Jewish community.

Played for the Maccabi Hakoah Shield, the competition is planned to become an annual event.

In summary, a difficult 1994 all around, but there is hopefully light at the end of the tunnel for Maccabi Hakoah Soccer Club.

However, the difficulty in obtaining communal support and funding, as well as an apparent divergence between the attitudes of those players who wish for social soccer and others who favour a professional outlook requires serious and thoughtful consideration if a solution is to be found in the short term.

During the year just ended the team fielded in the Eastern Suburbs Soccer Association's Third Division competition was the most successful, winning the league by defeating Barnstoneworth 2-0 in the grand final.

The season generally runs from March to August, with NSW Federation sides playing their home matches at the ES Marks Sydney Athletic Field in Moore Park, the former home ground of Sydney City Hakoah in the National Soccer League.

Home matches kick off at 1pm (reserve grade) and 3pm (firsts), with the fixtures regularly publicised in the Australian Jewish News.

As the club prepares for its 22nd season its list of distinguished former players who have been honoured with life membership of Maccabi Hakoah includes Phil Filler, Ron Lilling, Andrew Simons, Sam Skurnik, Victor Topper and Phil Wolanski.

The new President of the club is Terry Sperber.

NSW MACCABI TENPIN BOWLING CLUB

One of the Maccabi movement's largest affiliates in this state is NSW Maccabi Tenpin Bowling Club, which has been in continuous operation for close on three decades.

Over 200 members play competition every Sunday night at Manhattan Superbowl, Mascot, Rockdale Bowl and Hornsby Bowl.

In keeping with its policy of catering for everyone in the Jewish community, the Tenpin Club attracts competitors aged between ten and 70.

Three 13 week seasons make up the competitive year, which also includes intra club tournaments as well as interstate and international Maccabi competitions.

A tremendous feature of recent years has been the success of teams sent to several Maccabiah Games in Israel and European Maccabi Championships in Belgium and Denmark.

A dedicated Executive Committee has ensured the ongoing viability and growth of Jewish Tenpin Bowling in NSW, as a result Carnival teams are always well supported and members enthusiastically support the fundraising ventures of NSW Maccabi.

MACCABI TRIATHLON CLUB

Maccabi Triathlon entered its fifth year of competition in 1994, having been formed by a small band of enthusiasts in 1990.

The club divides its activities into summer and winter seasons each year, with Triathlon featured during the former and Biathlon in the latter.

Competition takes place on the third Sunday of each month, with the triathlons hosted by Heffron Park, Maroubra (October to April), and the biathlons conducted at McKay Oval, Centennial Park (May to September).

The club has about 25 active members, with generally around 14 competing at one of the club's events. Maccabi triathletes also make regular appearances at open events conducted over distances of up to 2km (swim), 80km (cycle) and 20km (run).

Both Cohen and Baral were picked to represent Australia at the World Championships in Manchester, England, soon after the Maccabiah in Israel.
