


#### Transatlantic Cup

### Mending Bones and Building Bridges: Ricky Reff — Sports Orthopedics

"... The thigh bone's connected to the hip bone and the ..." the words of an old song whose anatomy is well understood by physicians. And somewhere, Dr. Richard Reff is understanding and developing another connection — between sports, kids and Israel.

When not tending to the ligaments, cartilage or bones of athletes, Ricky Reff can be found

working on their behalf. His love of sports, especially skiing and racquetball, helped him to choose his specialty as a sports medicine orthopedic surgeon. But his love of Israel and dedication to getting kids to understand their heritage is just as fundamental.


It was this same love of sports and athletics that fostered his interest in Maccabi USA/Sports for Israel some 14 years ago. A fellow Marylander and longtime board member of the organization, Alan Sherman, spoke with him when a team of wheelchair athletes from the Israel Sports Center for the Disabled visited the DC-area in 1982.

Ricky liked what he heard about our organization and knew that this was an organization where he could incorporate all of his talents and interests. He serves on Maccabi USA/Sports for Israel's board of directors, also serving in a variety of chairmanships with US Maccabiah Teams and with the Greater Washington DC Jewish Community Center, and all of these activities include his family.

In 1985 he served as a physician for the US Maccabiah Team and as chairman for the trainers; repeating his role as trainers chairman in 1989 and served as co-chairman of the medical staff and as chairman of the juniors. In the 1993 Games he again served a dual chairmanship of the medical team and trainers, and is serving in that capacity for the 15th Maccabiah in 1997. He also serves as an International Maccabiah Committee (IMC) delegate.

In spite of all of his involvement with the medical, Ricky loves working for and with the children. He maintains his involvement with his local JCC, but also serves as Maccabi USA/Sports for Israel's delegate representative with the JCCA.

Locally, he has headed the delegation of young athletes from the Greater-Washington JCC since the JCC Maccabi Youth Games in Toronto in 1986. His wife of 23 years Vicki, competed in her first Maccabiah Games in 1993, earning several medals as a member of the Masters Swim Team. Their daughter Erika competed on the soccer team at the JCC Maccabi Youth Games in Baltimore in 1992 and the other Reff children, Laura and Michael, will probably end up on the playing fields too. But, most assuredly they will return to Israel in 1997, maintaining that link between Israel, sports and family.





### Sports Links ... From Squash to Golf Is Marvin Waronoff

What do you do when you love two sports that demand a lot of practice time, work and are civic-minded? Incorporate these "loves" into your everyday life! Which is precisely what Marvin Waronoff did.

Eight years ago, the top ten nationally ranked masters squash player, vied for and earned a spot on the US Maccabiah Masters Squash Team. Though he returned from Israel in 1989 without a medal he received something much more valuable — a love for the sponsoring organization and a desire to work with them.

Though he was nominated to Maccabi USA/Sports for Israel's board in 1991 and has served in that capacity ever since he wanted to do more.

As we approach the 1997 Games, it is nice to know that Marvin is there for the individual city's golf committees, doing what they can so that American Jewish kids will have the chance to share in the 15th Maccabiah Games in Israel!

"The great thing about this organization is its sense of belonging," noted Waronoff. "The people involved become friends, dear friends like family and no matter what, through the good times and the tragic, they will always be there for you, anywhere in the US. Bobbie and I know that and that's why we do what we do, as I'm sure everyone involved does, too."







