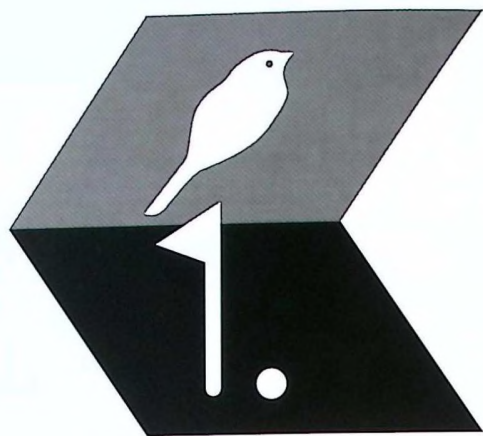

Carnival Office

The carnival office is located in the Function Room No. B at Bayview On The Park for all information, visitors' tickets and photos. The office phone number is 9243 9999.

Team Management

Each state team has its management consisting of a team manager, assistant team managers and section managers. These people are in charge of each team and their instructions must be adhered to at all times.

Identity (ID) Cards

Your personal ID card will be issued to all registered team members. Team members must wear their ID cards at all times and if a card is lost, it must be reported immediately to that person's team manager. The transfer of ID cards is strictly forbidden as your ID card will give you entry to all sporting and social events during the carnival. If you do not have your ID card with you at a function, you may be required to pay an entry fee which will be determined by the carnival manager Lisa Borowick.

Shabbat Services

It is a requirement of all team members to attend at least one shabbat service during the carnival. Carnival shabbat services will be held at St Kilda Hebrew Congregation and Temple Beth Israel.

MACCABI HONOURS AND REMEMBERS

The George Myers Memorial Torch

THE SPIRIT AND IDEALS OF CARNIVALS
PROMOTE UNDERSTANDING, COMRADESHIP
AND SPORTSMANSHIP AMONG THE JEWISH
YOUTH OF AUSTRALIA.

No one person was a finer example of these attributes than the late George Myers and the kindling of his memorial torch, each year, not only bridges the gap since George's death but reaffirms that these ideals still guide Maccabi in its endeavours. George Myers worked tirelessly for Maccabi in Queensland and was a very active member of the community. His father Arthur Myers is the patron of Maccabi Queensland Incorporated.

The torch is 50cms high and embodies the coat of arms of the five state members of Maccabi Australia Incorporated. It was first used on December 24, 1961 at the opening of the 29th Australian Maccabi Sports Carnival in Melbourne. The lighting of the torch signals the opening of each carnival and when the torch is extinguished at the closing ceremony, it is handed over to the team manager whose state will host the next carnival.

In this simple ceremony, Maccabi perpetuates the memory of a person who did so much for Jewish sport and ensures the perpetuation of its ideals.

Memorial to the "Eleven"

On December 30, 1973, a memorial to the eleven Israeli athletes murdered at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich was unveiled and dedicated at the Jewish Centre in Canberra.

A chartered plane from Sydney carried 137 carnival competitors and officials to the occasion.

The memorial was unveiled by the president of Maccabi in Australia Mr Joe Rosen and other dignitaries. An Israeli athlete, Yair Pantilat laid a wreath on behalf of all Israeli sportsmen. At carnival we remember this tragedy.

The Maccabi Torch

From Modi'in, the ancient burial ground of the Maccabees and the home of the Maccabi Australia / and JNF Forest, comes the torch which is first used to light the George Myers Memorial Torch to mark the opening of the carnival.

The torch was a chanukah gift from Maccabi World Union and is a replica of the one used to light the flame at the Maccabiah Games which will be held in Israel in 1997. The torch has been used to light chanukah candles in Perth, Adelaide, Melbourne, Brisbane and Sydney.

MACCABI AUSTRALIA & JNF FOREST IN MODI'IN, ISRAEL

The Maccabi Australia forest was inaugurated in 1993 at a special ceremony in Modi'in, Israel - the birth place of Judah Maccabee, the father of the Maccabi movement.

More than 100 members of Australia's 14th Maccabiah team attended the moving ceremony along with the Australian Ambassador to Israel William Fisher and officials from the Jewish National Fund (JNF).

The forest was the initiative of past-president of MAI and current Vice

President of MWU David Grace. MAI is committed to ensuring that every participant at senior and junior carnivals and Maccabiah Games will have a tree in the forest planted in his or her name.

By inaugurating the forest, MAI became the first organisation in the diaspora to enter into such and agreement with the JNF in Israel. The forest has now become a tremendous link between Australia and Israel.

An official plaque has been erected signifying the opening of the forest and

all those who were in attendance during the 14th Maccabiah planted small saplings to start the forest.

MAI actively promotes the centrality of Israel in Jewish life through Zionist activities amongst its members.

During the forthcoming 15th Maccabiah in 1997 a ceremony will be held for athletes to plant more trees. MAI also offers special tree packages for simchas and other special occasions.

MAKING JEWISH SPORT IN AUSTRALIA TICK

MAKING JEWISH SPORT IN
AUSTRALIA TICK IS THE ROLE OF
MACCABI AUSTRALIA INC. (MAI),
BUT WHAT IS MAI AND WHAT
DOES IT DO?

MAI is the roof body of all Jewish sporting organisations in Australia and is the country's largest grass-root organisation.

The aim of MAI is to promote and maintain Jewish identity through sporting, cultural, Zionist and social activities.

There are nearly 6000 Maccabi Members in Australia. The national Maccabi roof body was established in Australia in 1957 as the Australian Judean Sports Council.

Its name has evolved into the Australian Maccabi Council, the Australian Maccabi Federation and since 1991 stands proudly as MAI.

This latest change was more significant than a mere change in wording as it beckoned a new direction in administration, credibility and professionalism throughout Australian Jewry. MAI is affiliated to the Maccabi World Union, the Zionist Federation of Australia, the executive

council of Australian Jewry and the Australian Sports Foundation.

What does MAI do?

The network of MAI's responsibilities is all-encompassing and includes:

Organising Australian teams to compete in international events (eg. the Maccabiah Games, the North American Youth Games).

Conducting annual junior and senior interstate sporting carnivals.

Holding leadership and training seminars.

Participating in Zionist activities.

Monitoring the day to day functioning of its affiliates.

Co-ordinating its programs with other Jewish organisations.

This work is carried out by an elected group of honorary volunteers who devote their time to achieve the goal of promoting and maintaining Jewish identity.

MAI is effectively run by an Australian-wide executive with five committees to cover areas of:

Senior sport

Junior sport

International sport

Culture & public relations

Finance.

These committees set policy and guide Maccabi in Australia through its activities.

PREPARING FOR THE ULTIMATE THE 15TH MACCABIAH GAMES

L
LARGEST TEAM EVER SET FOR
15TH MACCABIAH GAMES

An Australian team of close to 400 is expected to be named to compete at the 15th Maccabiah Games in Israel at the conclusion of the 64th Australian Maccabi Sports Carnival in Melbourne.

Head of the Australian team Louis Platus OAM, said he believed that Australia would eclipse its 14th Maccabiah team numbers and field the largest team ever when the Games begin on July 14, 1997.

'The Maccabiah Games are being billed as the 'time of peoples lives', and having attended six Maccabiah team numbers and field the largest event for Jewish athletes,' Mr. Platus said.

'Marching into an Olympic-style stadium in front of 65,000 screaming Jewish fans is a once-in-a-life-time experience and competing in Israel against Jews from around the World is also a fantastic experience.'

In October 1996, Australia's Maccabiah Organising Committee (MOC) named more than 280 people in preliminary squads reflecting Australia's strong showing at the 14th Maccabiah which saw a record total of 53 medals (16 gold, 20 silver and 17 bronze) in 1993.

Earlier this year, MOC also announced the following people as winners of its inaugural 15th

Maccabiah Outstanding performance and Encouragement Award:

Brad Rosen (NSW) who also has a playing contract with the National Basketball Association team the Sydney Kings.

Todd Greenberg (NSW) who plays first grade cricket for Randwick in Sydney.

Simon Yudelavitch (VIC) represented Australia in beach volleyball.

Michael Klinger (VIC) became the youngest cricket player ever to score a century in Melbourne's District first grade competition.

David Schneider (WA) is ranked 7th in open competition and recently finished 4th in the International Canberra Cup and was the first placed Australian.

The outstanding performance award has been established by Australia's 15th Maccabiah Organising Committee (MOC) in agreement with Maccabi Australia Inc. to encourage Australia's best Jewish athletes.

Each recipient of the award received an allocation of \$500 from the Maccabiah team assistance fund which will go towards their package if they are selected and compete in Israel at the Games. The \$500 is not a direct

monetary prize, it is a bonus value which if the recipient does compete for Australia at the Games will not have to cover (either through fundraising or from an individual's personal funds).

Mr. Platus said the recipients of the award had achieved significant results during 1996 which MOC identified as worthy of encouragement.

'Jewish sports people like these are perhaps the best we have in Australia and we look forward to their participation at the 15th Maccabiah Games,' he said.

'The outstanding talent of the award winners, together with the talent selected by various sports chair people should flow over into the Australian team when it is announced at the end of the Melbourne Carnival.'

'I think the result of putting the squads together so early and identifying top sports people, will go along way to winning medals in Israel.'

'We have a very high standard in our strength sports such as squash, track and field, cricket, triathlon, tenpin bowling and netball.'

PLAYING THE MENORAH

GAME THURSDAY 2 JANUARY 1997

THE MENORAH GAME WAS
DEVELOPED IN ISRAEL BY
MACCABI WORLD UNION TO
PROMOTE JEWISH IDENTITY.

It is primarily a quiz/activity game involving a group of people and will be played for the second time out of Israel during the 64th Australian Maccabi Sports Carnival.

For the purposes of playing the game as a carnival event, mixed teams from each state comprising of no more than five people will be entered. More than one team from each state may be entered if numbers permit.

The game will be co-ordinated by Anat Shechter with the assistance of a Master of Ceremonies. Also, seven expert judges will be in attendance at each station to adjudicate and award points.

There are seven categories or stations that make up the game, which equal the seven branches of the Menorah, hence the name. The seven stations are as follows: 1 Israel, 2 Famous Jewish People, 3 Jewish History, 4 Jewish Symbols, 5 Jewish

Holidays, 6 Sport and 7 Jerusalem.

Points are awarded at each station, depending on the level of difficulty selected by the team.

The winner of the game will be the team with the most points after the conclusion of the final round.

Rules of the game

- 1 Each state will enter a team consisting of five people (preferably a mixed team).
- 2 Each team decides the order they want to attempt each of the seven stations and the level of difficulty. This information is presented to the co-ordinator (Anat) 30 minutes prior to the game commencing (see example below).

Example station order:

Queensland team (Michael, Ben, David, Sarah and Avi).

No Level of difficulty

2 Hard

4 Easy

5 Middle

1 Hard

6 Easy

7 Easy

3 Hard

- 3 Each station has three levels of difficulty: the hardest level equals 5 points, the middle level equals 4 points and the easiest level equals 3 points. Questions and activities at each station are devised according to the level of difficulty selected by the team. The exact questions and activities will not be known by the teams until they reach each station.
- 4 Each team will be allowed 10 minutes at each station to answer a group of questions or have to undertake an activity related to the level of difficulty chosen.
