



Maccabi Tel-Aviv is the first established & most successful basketball club in Israel.

It all started in the mid-thirties in the center of Tel-Aviv as part of the Maccabi Tel-Aviv Sports Club (founded 1906) which has been active in many other sports like Football (17 league titles), Handball, Volleyball, Tennis, Table Tennis, Athletics, Swimming, Judo (1992 olympic silver medallist Yael Arad is a member of the club), Wrestling, Weight-Lifting, etc.

The Basketball league in Israel started in 1954 & Maccabi TA were the first champions. They have dominated the championship ever since, winning the title 36 times, including a run of 23 titles in a row between 1970 & 1992, most probably a world record. Maccabi is considered as Israel's national sporting representative in the world.

Another unique record was the fact that during the seventies Maccabi Tel-Aviv had three teams playing in the national league: two in the men's & one in the women's.

For the last 26 years Maccabi Tel-Aviv has been sponsored by ELITE, Israel's largest food company, & it also carries its name.

Most of Maccabi's head coaches, were ex-players at the club: Yehoshua Rozin was involved with the club for 40 years. Ralph Klein started as an 18 years old player & later had several spells as a coach & led the club to its first European title in 1977. Zvi Sherf played for Maccabi's second team & is now in his third spell as a coach. All three of them were also - Sherf still is - in charge of the national team.

Maccabi Tel-Aviv has always been proud to provide the national team with a large number of players. Five of Maccabi's players, headed by Avraham Shneur, were on the team which represented Israel on its first European Championship in 1953 in Moscow.

Tanhum Cohen-Mints was one of Europe's top centers in the sixties & was selected for the first European All Star Team which played in Madrid in 1964. Mickey Berkovits, Motty Aroesti, Lou Silver & Eric Menkin played a major part in winning the silver medal in the European Championship in 1979 in Torino. Doron Jamchy, who has left this summer after 11 seasons, is still the national team captain.

## MACCABI ELITE TEL AVIV

Maccabi Tel-Aviv was the first Israeli club to enter the European Cup for Champions in 1958. They were the first & only Israeli club to play in a final (1967 Cup Winners Cup) & to win the Champions Cup in 1977 & 1981. So far Maccabi has played in seven Champions Cup finals.

Maccabi Tel Aviv was also the first Israeli club to participate in the McDonald Open Tournament in London, in October 1995.

In 1994 Maccabi Tel-Aviv organized the FINAL FOUR in Tel-Aviv. European All Star Selections played four times in Tel-Aviv to honour Maccabi TA players: Tani Cohen-Mints, Tal Brody, Lou Silver & in December 1995, Mickey Berkovits.

## MACCABI ELITE TEL AVIV

Maccabi Tel-Aviv was the first Israeli club to enter the European Cup for Champions in 1958. They were the first & only Israeli club to play in a final (1967 Cup Winners Cup) & to win the Champions Cup in 1977 & 1981. So far Maccabi has played in seven Champions Cup finals.

Maccabi Tel Aviv was also the first Israeli club to participate in the McDonald Open Tournament in London, in October 1995.

In 1994 Maccabi Tel-Aviv organized the FINAL FOUR in Tel-Aviv. European All Star Selections played four times in Tel-Aviv to honour Maccabi TA players: Tani Cohen-Mints, Tal Brody, Lou Silver & in December 1995, Mickey Berkovits.
