



My thanks, too, to the people who made the production possible by their generosity of contributions.



Some 300 sportsmen and women suddenly descend on Sydney for an interstate carnival—from the north, west, south and east. Everything is arranged and runs with machine-like precision. Sports grounds materialise from nowhere, assorted gear is transported all over the place; big functions, with some 1,000 people present, are tremendous social successes; and, most important of all, some 180 visitors are billeted in private homes all over Sydney.

can count the hard workers on about ten fingers), it is a hard and constant grind with the seemingly simple matters presenting the toughest problem.

I was present at the Maccabean Hall a few days ago, and saw some of the backstage work in operation. I know quite something about these things, but nevertheless the detail work on hand really staggered me. The billeting team sat at a table, surrounded by lists of names—those who wanted billets and those who would be glad to supply. The demand exceeded the supply, and anxious heads thoughtfully went over the pros. and cons. again. Others were preparing badges, maps of Sydney, the full complement of carnival tickets, last minute instructions to place inside large envelopes, so that every competitor, either visitor or home State, would receive them on arrival day.

Letters were being prepared to those who were billeting people, telling them of the name and State from where the visitor hailed. The Hon. Treasurer worried himself stiff as to where he could gather a reliable team to man the turnstiles for the various sporting events. A hue and cry arose—"Who is F——n?" Half an hour lost whilst they discover he was like the famous Finnegin—in again, out again—he officially doesn't exist any more.

Over it all presides that stalwart of carnival work, Lou Rose. With practised hand he irons out difficulty after difficulty, at the same time busily inserting details into envelopes.

The whole team is tired as the clock comes round to midnight, because this just hasn't been a one-night affair, but the climax to 12 months' solid organisation.

So all you people who are enjoying yourselves—spare a thought and a genuine vote of thanks to those who have made this year's carnival possible. Remember the backstage boys —no glamour, no cheers—just a hard-working team.



# EARLY YEARS OF THE CARNIVAL

The greater the success of this year's interstate carnival, the more we will owe to the pioneers for the part they played in establishing the carnivals so long ago.

There were men in Melbourne, and there were men in Sydney, who felt almost simultaneously that something important was to be gained by interstate competitions.

Here in Sydney we were aware of uncommon keenness among the cricketers of the small clubs, grouped around Kardimah Hall, in Melbourne. And Melbourne seemed to know that

the little competitions between the Sydney players, associated in one way and another with the Maccabean Hall, were producing unusual enthusiasm—and good cricket.

It was this knowledge, and the friendly rivalry that it engendered, that brought about the first test of strength, at the end of 1924.

In the columns of Alfred Harris' Hebrew Standard appeared a paragraph, on September 12 of that year, informing that "an invitation has been received from the Associated Judean Athletic Clubs (Melbourne) to play a series of matches there during Christmas week."

With Sol Einfeld as manager, the following players went to Mel-

bourne: Max Cohen, Lou Cohen, Hymie Solomons, Roy Levy, Harry Fisher, Sol Barrow, Jack Solomons, Leo Levy, Cec. Alexander, Phil. Davis, Jack Hart, Harry Kausman and Sid Weinberg.

It wasn't a test match by cricket standards, but it was a start of a wonderful series, especially for Melbourne, which emerged victor for the Keith Cup, very comfortably.

By the end of 1925, Sydney was ready to avenge that defeat and, moreover, had drawn up a comprehensive sports programme, consisting of cricket, athletics, swimming and tennis, with the Hoffnung Shield to be held by the champion State.

Melbourne was represented by a very strong team, which included well known cricketers in Charlie Myers (captain), Cec Raphael, Morry Bardas, Wolf Molinsky and Phil Lewis.

Sydney had a liberal sprinkling of first-grade players in its side, and with Dave Marks as captain and Roy Levy as "openers," looked confidently for success.

The match was played at Hampden Oval, now Trumper Park, and Marks (135) and Levy (146) ended the Melbourne aspirations for asecond success.

Sydney was better prepared for the remaining events of the carnival, winning the athletics, swimming and tennis, all in the friendliest of atmospheres.

From that time the success of the interstate competitions was assured, and a very large contingent went south by the old "Riverina," in 1926, to continue the friendships and to perpetuate the rivalry. (CONTINUED FOOT NEXT PAGE)

# THE MACCABIAHS

The accompanying photograph records one of the proudest moments in the lives of Barney Peters, Bill Gland and myself. The ovation which we received as Australians will be something that we can never forget.

Fifty-five thousand voices echoed their welcome to Australia's first official representatives to a Maccabiah. We felt embarrassed at the same time, as all we Australians could offer were two sportsmen. This was a phenomenon that no official, nor indeed any private citizen, could understand in Israel.

We have already shown the Jewish sporting world that we can match the best from most other countries. Let's not be shy in 1957. Let's organise

all our top sportsmen and sportswomen, and finance their trip to the Fifth Maccabiah.

There is so much to be gained by the Australian Jewish community by sending a large team to Israel. But let us not forget that the Maccabiahs are not for sporting activities alone. The Maccabiahs are for Jewish sporting activities in Israel, where the Jewish youth from all over the world will meet and share their own and Israel's problems.

A Maccabiah, in many ways is like an interstate Jewish sports carnival, only on a larger scale. No other country in the world has Jewish sport organised as we have it here.

This year we will have both Australia's Fourth Maccabiah representatives in Sydney. But we will also have with us a young veteran of two Maccabiahs. Queensland is proud to announce that Miss Elizabeth Caplin, who represented Great Britain at both the Third and Fourth Maccabiahs in the swimming contests, will be a member of our swimming team this year. Although Miss Caplin has done little competitive swimming since the Fourth Maccabiah, her presence as a former representative of Great Britain should add colour to this present carnival.

Any who participated in those contests of far-off days will remember the pleasure of the annual meetings, the hospitality and the camaraderie, which broke down interstate barriers more than any other single factor.

And it is not too late to pay a tribute to pioneer organisers like Alex Brodsky in Sydney and Morry Bardas in Melbourne, who entered so enthuisiastically into their tasks.

Thirty-one years ago Alfred Harris wrote an editorial on the matter of these competitions. He declared: "The visit of Jewish cricketers from Sydney to play a game with a team of their co-religionists in Melbourne, is one that is fraught with much significance to Jewry generally."

Any who have seen how those initial meetings have grown may well believe that the significance is even greater, something that is Olympian in miniature, at the very least.

# **1924-1956**By LOU WHITEFIELD

I—and you, too—can travel to Melbourne, Sydney, Adelaide, Perth or Brisbane, and be certain we will find friends in each of these cities. Hundreds of Jewish young men and women can claim this privilege—because, after all, it is not such a rare distinction.

On the other hand, were it not for a certain sequence of events, we could land in any Australian city, unknown, friendless, and thus forlorn. Only those who have experienced this position can appreciate the bareness and loneliness of a hotel bedroom.

But we are not on that other hand. We are in that happy position of having all these Jewish interstate friends, so could we pause a moment and think back just how this has all come about for our mutual benefit.

I feel I am particularly qualified to discuss this subject because, on and off, and on various executives, I have been actively associated with Jewish interstate carnivals since the very inception in 1924. I have been on the inside, so to speak, over these many years, and very certainly know what has been done by so few for so many with such far-reaching results.

We—all of us—owe a tremendous debt to those who pioneered the carnivals. We continue to owe a debt to the unselfish small body of officials who carry on the big burden from year to year—whether it be in N.S.W. or any other State. The indestructible evidence of their work is before our very eyes right at this time—some 300 Jewish boys and girls gathered together from all over Australia in friendly sporting activities.

These meetings have cemented lifetime friendships, marriage, and a tolerant understanding which will stand us in good stead now and in the future. Dozens of us will gaily hail our friends from every State as the various means of transport bring them to Sydney this year. They are our friends and will always remain so, but let us always remember that it is the interstate sporting carnivals which have brought about this happy state of affairs.

It is in the Jewish interest to maintain the carnivals at any cost—and cost they certainly do. It is because of—and only because of—the interstate carnivals that we now have all these wonderful friends. To tell you how minutely the work has been done, spadeful by spadeful, and brick by brick, over a period covering 32 years, is impossible herein, although I started off with the idea of trying to tell you all about it. However, I think you will realise what I have been driving at.

Maintain these friendships, and assist others who are new to the carnivals to make friends also. When you return home to your respective States, I appeal to you not to forget the carnival until another year rolls by. You, too, can take your rightful place among the organising officials—and as one who is experienced in these matters, I ask you honestly to heed this parting request.

What a blessed thing is good friendship—but always give a thought to the sequence of events which bring this good companionship about.

# WHAT IS M.D.A.?

The Magen David Adom (Victoria) has been in existence a number of years, with the object of rendering assistance to the parent body in Israel on the one hand, and on the other, of acquainting the local Jewish community with its work.

The M.D.A. is the Jewish counterpart of the Red Cross Society, but in Israel it fulfils a number of specific tasks arising out of the unique nature of Israel problems.

It not only maintains a number of first-aid posts throughout the country, such as the well-known one at Lydda Airport—which is the charge of the Victorian M.D.A., but it also has a fleet of ambulances, and now has the largest blood-fractionation plant in the Middle East, located at Tel Aviv, and now in the final stages of completion.

It has built up a large blood bank to meet any kind of emergency, and at the request of the authorities, has organised units capable of setting up emergency hospitals in schools and other buildings not normally used for hospital work.

The Victorian M.D.A. has sent a considerable quantity of equipment to the parent organisation in Israel over the years, latterly this being a large number of bandages and dressings and funds to establish "bed-units" for the emergency hospital scheme.

The M.D.A. is also interested in local activities, supporting these wherever possible. Because of its desire to encourage Australian Jewish youth to build up physical health and strength, trophies were donated for annual competition.

These trophies are: (1) The M.D.A. Cup for Australia's outstanding Jewish sportsman/woman of the year. (2) The M.D.A. Cup for Australia's outstanding Jewish tennis player of the year.

The cups are awarded by the Australian Judaean Sports Council at annual interstate carnivals, taking into consideration achievements of the previous carnival and performances up to a month before the current carnival.

### THE MACCABIAH GAMES

On the 27th July, 1969 the 8th Maccabiah Games will be held in Israel. No matter the difficulties nor the problems, the organising committee are adamant that nothing shall prevent the Games taking place and already venues are being finalised and arrangements are being made for accommodation and transport.

As well as the usual sporting events at the 8th Maccabiah Games, it is intended that new innovations will be included. An Israel Day Celebration will be held in Tel Aviv on the day before the opening of the Games, and Jerusalem Day in that city will be arranged on the day before the Closing Ceremony. To allow visiting competitors to see and absorb as much of the





AMC has been created for the purpose of promoting the Australian Maccabi Sports Carnivals, harmonising and developing Jewish sport throughout Australia and controlling and organising international contests for Australian Jewish teams.

Through the AMC, Australia is affiliated with the Maccabi World Union, so enabling Australian competitors to participate in the Maccabiah Games held in Israel at four-yearly intervals.

It is customary for the administrative headquarters of the AMC to alternate between New South Wales and Victoria at four-yearly intervals.

Currently in New South Wales, the AMC executive comprise Mr. Lou Rose (president), Miss Dianne Goodman (hon. secretary) and Mr. Leon Syman (hon. treasurer).

# THE 10th MACCABIAH GAMES ISRAEL 1977

In a foreword to a publication on the forthcoming Games, the Chairman of the Maccabi World Union Dr. I. Peled says—

"The 10th Maccabiah is taking place in a period when the world is beset by problems and instead of the love of humanity we witness division and enmity between man and man.

Even in sport, whose task is to develop understanding and a fair relationship between rivals and competitors, there are those who strive to introduce an element of politics and to use sport as a political tool.

The Maccabiah is a demonstration of unity through sport of friendship and understanding. This is a demonstration of the Jewish people against those who wish to put obstacles in front of us in the International Sports Organisations. It is a sporting event whose object is to foster the love of sport and fair-play among Jewish youth all over the world."

Australia has been represented in 7 Maccabiah's with an ever growing number of competitors:— From a single representative in 1949, then 2 persons in 1953, 12 in 1957, 16 in 1961, 28 in 1965, 36 in 1969 and in the year 1973, 92 competitors made up the Australian Team.

The Maccabiah Games should not be compared with the Olympics or other sporting events. Maccabiah is a National sports gathering of Jewish sportsmen and women from all over the world, to compete in Israel, to see Israel and meet its people. Thus, it is of utmost importance that Australia competes in these games, and that Australia's flag is raised with the flag of other nations when the Games open in the Ramat Gan Stadium.

At the conclusion of this 44th Interstate Carnival, Australia's National Selectors will meet to select the athletes for the 10th Maccabiah Games, and we know that as in the past, the chosen Team will be a credit to Australia, both on the field of sport and as ambassadors. It has often been said that the greatest honour a Jewish sportsman or woman can obtain is to be considered good enough to be selected to represent Australia in a Maccabiah Games Team. But remember the spirit of Baron de Coubertin's "the importance is in the participation and not in the victory".

# THE MACCABI TORCH

From Modi'in, the ancient burial ground of the Maccabees, comes the torch which will be used to light our own Carnival Torch to mark the opening of the 44th Australian Maccabi Sports Carnival.



The torch has been used to light Chanuka candles in Perth, Adelaide, Melbourne and Sydney. Now bringing with it, the spirit of the Maccabees, the torch from Modi'in signifies the close relationship between the Maccabi World Union and the Australian Maccabi Federation.

#### THE GEORGE MYERS MEMORIAL TORCH

No one person was a finer example of all these attributes than the late George Myers, and in the kindling of his torch, each year, we not only bridge the gap since George's death, but we reaffirm that these ideals still guide us in our endeavours.

The torch is 20 inches high and embodies the coat of arms of the five State members of the Australian Maccabi Federation. The lighting of the torch by the President of the A.M.F. signals the opening of each Carnival and when the torch is extinguished at the conclusion, it is handed over to the Team Manager who's State will be hosts of the

next Carnival.

In this simple ceremony therefore we perpetuate the memory of a person who did so much for Jewish Sport and we ensure the perpetuation of our ideals with a flaming torch of fire.

#### **MEMORIAL TO THE "ELEVEN"**

On 30th December 1973, a memorial to the eleven Israeli athletes murdered at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich, was unveiled and dedicated at the Jewish Centre in Canberra. A chartered plane from Sydney carried 137 Carnival

competitors and officals for the occasion.

The memorial was unveiled by the then President of the Australian Maccabi Council, Mr Joe Rosen, and speakers at the dedication included Sir Edgar Tanner, President of the Australian Olympic Federation, Rabbi Dr A. Fabian and the Ambassador of Israel Mr Moshe Erell. An Israeli athlete Yair Pantilat layed a wreath on behalf of all Israeli sportsmen.

The memorial plaque was commissioned by the A.M.C., and was designed and sculptured by Lou Rose in baked

enamel and copper.

#### THE MACCABI TORCH

From Modi'in, the ancient burial ground of the Maccabees, comes the torch which will be used to light our own Carnival Torch to mark the opening of the 50th Australian Maccabi Sports Carnival.

The torch, a Chanuka gift from Maccabi World Union, is a replica of the torch used to light the flame at the last

Maccabiah Games.

The torch has been used to light Chanuka candles in Perth, Adelaide, Melbourne and Sydney. Now bringing with it the spirit of the Maccabees, the torch from Modi'in signifies the close relationship between the Maccabi World Union and the Australian Maccabi Federation.

### The Maccabiah Games' History

The Maccabiah Games which celebrate athletic achievement, were named after Judah Maccabeus, a Hebrew religious zealot (second century N.C.E.) who fought against the encroaching Hellenization of Jewish life symbolized by the Greek Olympic-style games and the cult of the physical.

However, Maccabeus, known as "the Hammer" because of his fighting skills, employed the physical for ultimately spiritual ends. His revolt against the occupying Syrian forces and their Hellenizing influence on the Jewish masses was the first recorded successful battle for religious freedom. The victory of Maccabeus and his band of zealots culminated in the recapture, cleansing and rededication of the Temple in Jerusalem on the 25th day of Kislev in 165 B.C.E., an event still commemorated in Jewish communities throughout the world on Hanukkah, the Festival of Lights.

In the late nineteenth century large numbers of Jews in Eastern Europe and the Middle East, suffering under religious oppression, turned to the development of their physical powers for their deliverance. Locked behind the wall of the ghetto, victimized by progroms, humbled, ridiculed and isolated from the outside world, they formed selfdefense units and gymnastic clubs to rejuvenate the muscles of a people devoted for centuries to the study of the Talmud and Torah. They drew their model from the hero who had used his strength in the service of securing religious freedom; the Maccabi name was adopted by such athletic clubs in Constantinople by 1895-96. Austro-Hungary and Germany soon followed the Turkish example; supported by Zionist leaders Theodor Herzl and Max Nordau, the movement spread rapidly. Not all clubs took the Maccabi name. Some were called Bar Kochba, after another famed Hebrew warrior; others, Hakoah, the Hebrew world for "strength". On the eve of World War I more than 100 Maccabi-style clubs existed in Europe. Subsequent developments, however, were probably not what Judah Maccabeus would have envisioned or understood.

The World Maccabiah Games were the inspiration of Yosef Yekutieli who wanted to build a bridge between Jewish youth in the Diaspora and in Palestine. Born in Russia in 1897, Yekutieli settled in Palestine in 1908 and served in the Turkish army in 1917-18. He was the only delegate from Palestine to the Maccabi World Congress in 1929, where he suggested a convocation of Jewish athletes in Palestine. The idea was unanimously accepted and dates for the games to be held in Tel Aviv, were set for March 29-April 16, 1932.

Twenty-two nations and 390 athletes participated.

The stadium was completed the night before the opening of the Maccabiah. The crude oval was built to seat 5,000 spectators but 25,000 jammed in and thousands more were turned away. Athletes were housed in private homes as close to the stadium as possible.

Compare this to the 12th Maccabiah in 1981, when thirty three nations and approximately 3,450 athletes participated, surely nothing succeeds more than success.

Not surprisingly the Maccabiah Games, which eventually gained International Olympic Committee recognition, have seen more budding doctors, lawyers, engineers and other professional people participants than any other athletic festival in the world.

The Maccabiah, sometimes called the "Jewish Olympics", gave Americans, Spitz (1965), Ramenofsky (1961) and Weinberg (1973) their first taste of international competition.

Several innovations of the Maccabiah have subsequently been copied by the Olympics. Basketball was a Maccabiah sport before it appeared in the 1936 Berlin Olympics. A women, Debra Turner-Markus, was the final torch bearer in the 1965 Maccabiah, three years before a female had the same honour at the Mexico City Olympics in 1968.

Maccabiah athletes who reside in and compete for one nation may compete for another when they change their residence. (This is not true of the Olympics). Thus Tal Brody, a member of the gold medal U.S.A. basketball team in 1965, led Israel to a 74-70 upset gold medal U.S.A. basketball team in 1965, led Israel to a 74-70 upset gold medal victory over America in the 1969 Maccabiah.

Track star Lorraine Lotzoff of South Africa, winner of the 100, 200 and 400 metres in 1965, met U.S.A. swimmer Richard Abramson at the Games that year. They were married and following motherhood she returned to Israel representing the U.S.A. in 1973. Mrs. Abramson captured a silver medal in the 200 and a bronze in the 100.

American David Berger, Maccabiah middleweight weightlifting gold medalist in 1969, made aliyah and representing Israel in the 1972 Olympics, was one of the eleven Israeli sportsmen slaughtered by Arab terrorists in Munich.

The 1935 Maccabiah was known as the "Aliyah Games." With war clouds approaching in Europe, Germany sent an inflated delegation of 134 athletes plus several large bands to Palestine. Other European nations did likewise, the athletes and "musicians" settling in Palestine rather than returning to their native lands.

The third Maccabiah was planned for 1938 but world events caused their cancellation. The Games were not resumed until 1950, this time in the newly created State of Israel, where they have since been staged.

It was in 1951, that Australia's participation began, with a team numbering 1 consisting of Elias Honig representing in tennis and reaching the quarter finals before being defeated by the eventual winner, South African champion and No. 1 Davis Cup player, Abe Segal. Honig settled in Isael and is currently the Director of Administration and Information at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

However, the warmth and excitement of participating upon "our soil" certainly spread as Australia has participated in every Maccabiah since and sent her largest contingent number 203 and participating in 17 sports to the 1981 Games.

Unfortunately our only names are currently mentioned in the Maccbiah record books, are those of Ivan Katz, featherweight 60 Kilogram weightlifter, whose snatch lift of 100 Kg. and total of 222.5 kg. was set in 1973, and in 1977 the swimming feat of Gillian Peters, swimming the 200 metre backstroke in 2.27.5 minutes.

Since 1957 the Games have been held on a fourvear cycle, the year after the Olympics. An International Maccabiah Games Committee, was formed in 1963; it works closely with the Israel Organizing Committees for the Maccabiah.

In 1961, a memorial was held for nations that once had participated in the Maccabiah but whose Jewish communities had been wiped out in the Holocaust or were no longer able to compete. It was staged during Israel's bar mitzvah year and shortly after the traumatic experience of the Eichmann trial.

The memorial, in English, French, and Spanish as well as Hebrew was for Germany, Poland, Rumania, Czechoslovakia, Yugoslavia, Hungary, Bulgaria, Lithuania, Latvia, Egypt, Lebanon, Syria, Morocco and Libya.

The last offical appearance by a Turkish delegation was in 1961. After this, under pressure from Arab nations, only Turkish Jewish observers were sent to Israel, each of them kissing Israel's soil after arriving at Lod (Ben-Gurion Airport) and the soil at each athletic site.

The first and last appearance of an Iranian delegation was in 1965. Sixty thousand Israelis in Ramat Gan Stadium booed the bewildered Iranians and drove them to tears because, unknowingly, their goose-stepping march touched the raw nerves of many Holocaust survivors.

The cold silence which greeted the first West German delegation as they paraded with their nation's flag brought tears to the eyes of the athletes during the 1969 opening ceremonies. However, once the competition began the Germans were cheered by the crowds.

The 1969 trip of the delegations to the Western Wall of Tisha B'Av was doubly emotional. Not only was this their first visit to reunited Jerusalem but also. when the teams returned to their quarters on the outskirts of Tel Aviv from Jerusalem, it learned that Israeli jets had been in an intense battle with Egyptian MIG fighters over Suez that morning.

The colourfully turbanned delegations from India were always an attraction at the Games. After 1969, however, they ceased attending the Maccabiah because of the exodus of Jews from India and because of the restrictive policies of Indira Gandhi, who bowed to Arab pressures.

Emotional memorial services were held for the eleven Munich martyrs during the 1973 opening ceremonials.

Proud one-member teams have come from Zaire, Japan and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Considerable viddishkeit envelops the Maccabiah Games, for they are much more than an athletic carnival. Jewish young people from around the world quickly find the thread that binds them together. The athletic aspect of the Games becomes secondary. Barriers of language and culture quickly dissolve under the blazing blue Israeli sky. Lasting friendships are made. There is an understanding and appreciation of one another as well as of the modern Maccabees of Israel. And underlying it all is a spirtual and religious awakening. What eventually emerges from each two-week Maccabiah experience is something that Judah Maccabeus would probably have loved after all.

### Maccabi World Union Representative: Joe Rosen


The Maccabi World Union has to our delight appointed Mr Joe Rosen as their representative at this 52nd Australian Sports Carnival.


From a very young age, Ze'ev has been involved in Maccabi Tzair, holding many positions of leadership and has been responsible for educational programmes for youth leaders.





# 40 Years at The Grounds


# A personal perspective by David Adonis

I remember as a small boy in the 1950's going to the Maccabean Grounds for the annual athletics event for children. This was, from memory, conducted during Chanukah, and involved races over 50-100 yards for children of various ages. But for me the most vivid memory was not the race - it was a very tall solid man with curly hair and a deep voice who was organising things. He seemed to go away towards the starting point and then when I turned around there he was coming from the finish line. This mystery perplexed me for some time, years in fact, until one day I realised it wasn't just one man, but two - yes the Sharp twins, Ivan and Mervyn.

As I became more familiar with the Maccabean Grounds over the next few years I learned that merely to say the Grounds was enough. We all played for the Maccabeans at the Grounds - In the 1990s my 10 year old son doesn't say the Grounds - he says 'Maccabi', which is right but somehow less appropriate.

My time at *the Grounds* in the early 60s was spent mainly in learning to play soccer. A feature of the patch at that time was the cinder base. Many a rueful encounter was made by soccer players with that unfriendly abrasive surface. Scratched upper thighs were the trade mark of Maccabean soccer players. Fortunately in its wisdom the Maccabean League eventually decided to resurface *the Grounds* to provide a more forgiving surface.

It was around the mid 1960's that for the first time in the history of the Grounds an Australian rules football match was played on its hallowed turf. This was a match involving an all star Maccabean team with the addition of one or two regular players (from the West Perth Cardinals) to help out. I forget who they played, but do remember being a boundary umpire for this auspicious event. Fortunately for the soccer club, Aussie rules never really caught on at the Grounds, although a Maccabi team did exist for a few years during the 1970's playing at Wordsworth Oval.

For me 1964 was an important year because of my entry into the Maccabean Cricket Club. For the next 25 years I played the game I love. In the 1960s and early 1970s the Maccabean and later Maccabi Cricket Clubs were very strong and at one stage fielded three teams. In 1994 there is only one team.

Towards the end of the 1960s an important event for all Maccabean sporting teams was the change of name - we became 'Maccabi'. That in itself was a bit hard to swallow

because of the loss of the traditional 'Maccabean' name imprinted in people's minds over a long period of time, but to add insult to injury no-one could pronounce 'Maccabi'. It was always 'Mack-aby' with an emphasis on the 'Mack'. I once wrote a poem about it, but that didn't help.

During the years up to the end of the 1960s one of the most significant events at *the Grounds* was the building of the first Carmel Primary School. This was particularly significant for cricketers for it gave them a roof to hit balls onto. This was a difficult task but later with the building of the high school it became easier. There were even windows which could be aimed at. Mind you I can't remember anyone actually breaking any.

The building of the Jewish Centre in 1973 was also a major advance for the Perth Jewish Community. The foresight of those fine pioneers of the Maccabean League was now really starting to bear fruit. We now had a Jewish sporting complex, a Jewish Day School, and an Aged Home all within the range of a decent drive from the nearby Mt Yokine Golf Club.

While I'm talking about the golf club I should mention fences. The fence between the Grounds and the Mt Yokine Golf Club was one of those cyclone wire types with barbed wire strands across the top. I was never quite sure whether it was to keep us off the golf course or the golfers off the Grounds. In the 1960's the cricket practice wickets were at right angles to the fence into the golf course. There were three main obstacles to retrieving the ball -

- 1. getting over or under the cyclone fence
- 2. negotiating a secondary fence once inside the golf course, and
- 3. actually finding the ball in the rough.


Fortunately over time the two fences deteriorated to an extent where it was very easy to gain entry - but finding the ball was still a problem!

In the late 1970s we also saw the laying of three turf wickets at *the Grounds*. The Maccabi cricketers led by David Saunders and Marcus Rosenwax worked manfully to carve out trenches, lay turf and plant grass. They were guided by the doyen of turf wickets - Roy Abbott from the WACA. In the years that followed the members of the cricket club tended, rolled and marked the wicket themselves. In recent years the Maccabi groundsman, Peter Jones, has taken over that role. Through it all, however, those wickets were always a 'batsman's paradise'.

The 1980s were marked by further expansion of Carmel School, culminating in the building of the new primary school fronting Woodrow Avenue in the early 1990s. In 1989 extensions were made to the playing area of *the Grounds* including the laying of two new cricket practice wickets.

The significant events for WA Maccabi in the 1990s were the laying of four all-weather tennis courts and the renovation of the old B'nai Brith Hall to become the Gordon Bloomfield Centre, officially opened in December 1992.

The Grounds I see in 1994 are a far cry from my boyhood memories of the 1950s yet through it all one memory always remains strong - the memorial pillars through which we drive to enter this historic venue. They were built for the official opening of the Grounds in 1952. They stand as a monument to four decades of Maccabean and Maccabi workers who have made the dream of the pioneers of the 1950s a reality.

# Message From The President of Maccabi World Union

It is with the greatest pleasure that I wish to extend to all of you the greetings of Maccabi World Union.

It is very exciting to see how far-flung our Movement has become. Today, local Maccabi games or activities take place in nearly every country in the world in which there is a Jewish community.

In the few months since I assumed the Presidency of the Movement I have had the pleasure of assisting to the North American Maccabi Youth Games in Cleveland, the Masters Maccabi Games in Sao Paulo, Brazil and now to the Australian Carnival in Perth. It is truly surprising to see how in such distant corners of the world the Maccabi Movement brings its message of Jewish identity through sports and cultural and social activities.

At this time I would like to take the opportunity to reflect for a moment at the recent political developments in the Jewish world. The State of Israel has signed its 3rd. The organisers and participants of the Carnival are truly an example to the world of our commitment to Jewish education and Jewish values.

# George Myers Memorial Torch

The spirit and ideals of Maccabi Sports Carnivals is to promote understanding, comradeship and sportsmanship among the Jewish youth of Australia. No one person was a finer example for all these attributes that the late George Myers, and the kindling of his memorial torch each year, not only bridges the gap since George's death, but reaffirms that these ideals still guide Maccabi in its endeavours.

The Torch is 50cm high and embodies the coat of arms of the five State members of Maccabi Australia Incorporated. The lighting of the torch by the President of MAI signals the opening of each Carnival and, when the torch is extinguished at the conclusion, it is handed over to the Team Manager whose State will be host to the next Carnival.

In this simple ceremony therefore, Maccabi perpetuates the memory of a person who did so much for Jewish sport and ensures the perpetuation of its ideals.

### Memorial to the "Eleven"

n December 30, 1973, a memorial to the eleven Israeli athletes murdered at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich was unveiled and dedicated at the Jewish Centre in Canberra. A chartered plane from Sydney carried 137 Carnival competitors and officials for the occasion.

The memorial was unveiled by the then President of the Australian Maccabi Council, Joe Rosen, and speakers at the dedication included Sir Edgar Tanner, President of the Australian Olympic Federation, Rabbi Dr A. Fabian and the Ambassador of Israel, Moshe Erell. An Israeli athlete, Yair Pantilat laid a wreath on behalf of all Israeli sportspersons.

## The Maccabi Torch

From Modi'in, the ancient burial ground of the Maccabees, comes the torch which is used to light the torch to mark the opening of the 62nd Australian Maccabi Sports Carnival.

The torch, a Chanukah gift from Maccabi World Union, is a replica of the one used to light the flame at the Maccabiah Games.

The torch has been used to light Chanukah candles in Perth, Adelaide, Melbourne, Brisbane and Sydney. Now bringing with it the spirit of the Maccabees, the torch from Modi'in signifies the close relationship between the Maccabi World Union and Maccabi Australia Incorporated.

It is at these times we feel an event greater bonding with each other and particularly our Maccabi friends in Israel.


I hope that your participation in this carnival will inspire some of you to nominate for selection in the team to the next Maccabiah Games in Israel in 1997.

# A message from the 63rd Carnival Manager – Paul Myers

t is with a great
feeling of pride and
a sense of history in
the making, that as
both carnival
manager and Maccabi
Queensland president I
welcome you all to the 63rd
Australian Maccabi Sports
Carnival on the Gold Coast.

There would be few of you at this carnival who would know that my late father, Meredith (Merry) Myers, was the carnival manager of the 18th Australian Interstate Sports Carnival in 1950/51, which was the first carnival held in Queensland. My father again managed the next carnival in Queensland in 54/55, which was the 22nd. The carnival participants increased from 102 four years before to 350 at this one. Dad still was not finished with managing carnivals, after a break in 58/59 at which my late cousin, George Myers (whose name lives on with the lighting of the memorial flame at each carnival) was manager, he then managed the 30th carnival in 62/63.

So you can see, there was some inevitability about my taking on such a position. Maccabi has played a very important part in my life and that of my entire family. My first carnival was the 36th in 68/69 in


Sydney, I was 13 and our carnival patron, Gerald Moses was my team manager. Since then, I have lost track of the number of carnivals I have attended, although I am sure Bernie Gold could tell me.

What I can never forget is the life-long friendships made over the many years. Although years may go by, every time I see my friends from around Australia, I am truly thankful, that people such as my father did what they did in those early years.

I have no doubts that some of you who are at a carnival for the first time, will carry this tradition on well into the next century.

This year Israel has figured prominently on the world stage especially with the amazing peace process and the assassination of Yitzhak Rabin, as well as the celebrations for Jerusalem's 3000th year which will climax in the most amazing party in July, at which Maccabi Australia will take the first ever official group tour to Israel outside of a Maccabiah.

I am especially pleased to welcome the new Ambassador of Israel, Mr Shmuel Moyal to Queensland for the first time to open this carnival.



His visit, is yet another demonstration of Maccabi's close links with Israel.

We have instituted many innovations this carnival including the inaugural holding of the "Menorah Game" developed by the MWU in Israel. Also, we have been able, through our shlicha, Anat Shechter, establish a twinning of towns in Israel for the duration of carnival, as well as having personal contact with hundreds of Israeli's through a pen pal style scheme.

For the first time in Queensland, the carnival will be fully kosher and although this does not seem to be a big deal to people from Sydney and Melbourne, this has been a major challenge which we have met head on.

We are delighted that carnivals continue to attract interest from all our members throughout Australia.





#### A Maccabi tribute to the late

## Yitzhak Rabin Prime Minister of Israel



he entire world was shocked to hear that on November 4, 1995 the Prime Minister of Israel Yitzhak Rabin had been assassinated by a fellow Jew who was so violently opposed to the peace process.

At this carnival time, Maccabi members in Australia remember Mr Rabin for his efforts to bring peace to the land of Israel.

I was privileged to attend a private meeting with Mr Rabin in early 1995. Obviously, it was an exciting moment to personally meet the political leader of Israel, but I was doubly moved to be in the presence of the architect of Israel's major triumphs.

Born in Jerusalem in 1922 into a devotedly Zionist family, he was an early witness to and object of Arab terrorism. Although a kibbutz farmer by preference, he decided early that his first obligation rested in the defence and protection of his people. He participated in many early illegal rescue activities bringing Holocaust survivors to Israel and served in the Haganah with distinction in the preindependence struggle.



At the end of a 35 year military career terminating as chief-of-staff, he succeeded Golda Meir as Israel's first native born Prime Minister.

I was profoundly moved to hear Rabin spell out to me his closest personal views in his role as peace maker. He said to me that he had to choose between continuing war, terror and bloodshed or having to negotiate with one of his greatest foes – Yasser Arafat and the PLO.

His negotiating base was that the fulfilment of the dream of the restoration of the land of Israel, a land of peace and security for all of its inhabitants, their children and grandchildren. Rabin knew all too well that this meant the separation of Jews and Palestinians.

Some of his last words which he uttered at the fateful peace rally in Tel Aviv was that: "This gathering must send a message to the Israelis, to the Arab world, to the Jews across the world and to the whole world that we want peace."

Headlines in Israel's newspapers after Rabin's untimely murder said: "We heard you Yitzhak and we swear to you that we will continue the song of peace, that we will continue to fight for peace."

May he rest in peace.



# General carnival information to help you

he for information been help

he following information has been gathered to help you make the most of carnival.

#### CARNIVAL OFFICE

The carnival office is located on the lower ground floor of Ocean Blue Resort for all information, merchandise, visitors tickets, photos and Israel desk. The office phone no. is (07) 5593 3363.

#### TEAM MANAGEMENT

Each state team has its management consisting of a team manager, assistant team managers and section managers. These people are in charge of each team and their instructions must be adhered to at all times.

# honours and remembers

#### The George Myers Memorial Torch

The spirit and ideals of carnivals promote understanding, comradeship and sportsmanship among the Jewish youth of Australia. No one person was a finer example of all these attributes than the late George Myers and the kindling of his memorial torch, each year, not only bridges the gap since George's death but reaffirms that these ideals still guide Maccabi in its endeavours. George Myers worked tirelessly for Maccabi in Queensland and was a very active member of the community. His father Arthur Myers is the patron of Maccabi Queensland Incorporated.

The torch is 50 cms high and embodies the coat of arms of the five state members of Maccabi Australia Incorporated. It was first used on December 24, 1961 at the opening of the 29th Australian Maccabi Sports Carnival in Melbourne. The lighting of the torch signals the opening of each carnival and when the torch is extinguished at the closing ceremony, it is handed over the team manager whose state will host the next carnival. In this simple ceremony, Maccabi perpetuates the memory of a person who did so much for Jewish sport and ensures the perpetuation of its ideals.

#### Memorial to the "Eleven"

On December 30, 1973, a memorial to the eleven Israeli athletes murdered at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich was unveiled and dedicated at the Jewish Centre in Canberra. A chartered plane from Sydney carried 137 carnival competitors and officials to the occasion.

The memorial was unveiled by the president of Maccabi in Australia Mr Joe Rosen and other dignatories. An Israeli athlete, Yair Pantilat laid a wreath on behalf of all Israeli sportsmen.

At carnival we remember this tragedy.

#### The Maccabi Torch

From Modi'in, the ancient burial ground of the Maccabees and the home of the Maccabi Australia/and JNF Forest, comes the torch which is first used to light the George Myers Memorial Torch to mark the opening of the carnival.

The torch was a chanukah gift from the Maccabi World Union and is a replica of the one used to light the flame at the Maccabiah Games which will be held in Israel in 1997. The torch has been used to light chanukah candles in Perth, Adelaide, Melbourne, Brisbane and Sydney.

## Forest in Modi'in, Israel

he Maccabi Australia forest was inaugurated in 1993 at a special ceremony in Modi'in, Israel - the birth place of Judah Maccabee, the father of the Maccabi movement.

More than 100 members of Australia's 14th Maccabiah team attended the moving ceremony along with the Australian Ambassador to Israel William Fisher and officials from the Jewish National Fund (JNF).

The forest was the initiative of immediate past-president of MAI David Grace. MAI is committed to ensuring that every participant at senior and junior carnivals and the Maccabiah Games will have a tree in the forest planted in his or her name.

By inaugurating the forest, MAI became the first organisation in the diaspora to enter into such and agreement with the JNF in Israel. The forest has now become a tremendous link between Australia and Israel.

An official plaque has been erected signifying the opening of the forest and all those who were in attendance during the 14th Maccabiah planted small saplings to start the forest. MAI actively promotes the centrality of Israel in Jewish life through Zionist activities amongst its members.

During the forthcoming 15th Maccabiah in 1997 a ceremony will be held for athletes to plant more trees. MAI also offers special tree packages for simchas and other special occasions.



## SPORT in Australia tick

aking Jewish sport in Australia tick is the role of Maccabi Australia Inc. (MAI), but what is MAI and what does it do?

MAI is the roof body of all Jewish sporting organisations in Australia and is the country's largest grass-root organisation.

The aim of MAI is to promote and maintain Jewish identity through sporting, cultural, Zionist and social activities.

There are nearly 6000 Maccabi Members in Australia.

The national Maccabi roof body was established in Australia in 1957 as the Australian Judaean Sports Council.

Its name has evolved into the Australian Maccabi Council, the Australian Maccabi Federation and since 1991 stands proudly as MAI.

This latest change was more significant than a mere change in wording as it beckoned a new direction in administration, credibility, and professionalism throughout Australian Jewry.

MAI is affiliated to the Maccabi World Union, the Zionist Federation of Australia, the Executive Council of Australian Jewry and the Australian Sports Foundation.

#### What does MAI do?

The network of MAI's responsibilities is allencompassing and includes:

- Organising Australian teams to compete in international events (e.g. the Maccabiah Games, the North American Youth Games).
- Conducting annual junior and senior interstate sporting carnivals.
- Holding leadership and training seminars.
- Participating in Zionist activities.
- Monitoring the day-to-day functioning of its affiliates.
- Co-ordinating its programs with other Jewish organisations.

This work is carried out by an elected group of honourary volunteers who devote their time to achieve the goal of promoting and maintaining Jewish identity.

MAI is effectively run by an Australian-wide executive with five committees to cover areas of:

- · Senior sport.
- Junior sport
- International sport.
- Culture & public relations.
- Finance.

These committees set policy and guide Maccabi in Australia through its activities.



Griffith University has recently established a campaign to raise funds towards a collection of law material in honour of Sir Zelman Cowen. The campaign is designed to establish the Sir Zelman Cowen Law Collection as on the major specialist law libraries in Australia.

ell known as the Jewish Olympics, the Maccabiah Games is the highlight of any Jewish athlete's sporting career and Australia's organising committee for the 15th Maccabiah is looking for the best possible team.

Maccabiah Organising Committee (MOC) Louis Platus said the Australian team will build on the successes of the 14th Maccabiah team.

"We sent over 300 athletes to the games in 1993 and I think we can go that one better," he said.

"We want to and will attract the best possible sports people. There are some very talented sportspeople in Australia and we are determined to select the cream to lead Australia's team to the 15th Maccabiah."

He said MOC was already in the process of naming squads even though the games were two years away.

Australia looks like competing in the following open sports: basketball (men and women), bridge (men and women), cricket, field hockey, soccer, golf, karate (men and women), lawn bowls (men and women), indoor soccer, netball, squash (men and women), swimming (men and women), table tennis, tennis (men and women), tenpin bowling (men and women), track and field (men and women), triathlon (men and women), volleyball, water polo and wrestling.

The junior competition will be eligible to boys and girls born in 1981, 1982 or 1983 and Australia look like sending teams to compete in the junior

competition in the following sports: soccer, swimming (boys and girls), table tennis (boys and girls), tennis (boys and girls), track and field (boys and girls), basketball (boys), volleyball (girls) and netball.

In the masters competition Australia will compete in the following sports: track and field, golf, squash (men and women), table tennis and tennis.

On the administrative side, MOC has also got a jump on its previous efforts putting in place Shelley Ezekiel (NSW) as its executive administrator.

This is the first time such a position has been in place and it will take a lot of the pressure off the day-to-day running of the team which in the past has been done by unpaid-paid volunteers.

Shelley has competed at three Maccabiah Games and together with her whole family have been heavily involved in the local, national and international Maccabi movement spanning more than 20 years.

## Menorah

Game - Wednesday January 3, 1995

he Menorah Game was developed in Israel by the Maccabi World Union to promote Jewish identity. It is primarily a quiz/activity game involving a group of people and will be played for the first time out of Israel during the 63rd Australian Maccabi Sports Carnival.

For the purposes of playing the game as a carnival event, mixed teams from each state comprising of no more than five people will be entered. More than one team from each state may be entered if numbers permit.

The game will be co-ordinated by Anat Shechter with the assistance of a Master of Ceremonies. Also, seven expert judges will be in attendance at each station to adjudicate and award points.

There are seven categories or stations that make up the game, which equal the seven branches of the Menorah, hence the name. The seven stations are as follows:1) Israel, 2) Famous Jewish people, 3) Jewish history, 4) Jewish symbols, 5) Jewish holidays, 6) Sport and 7) Jerusalem.

Points are awarded at each station, depending on the level of difficulty selected by the team.

The winner of the game will be the team with the most points after the conclusion of the final round.

#### Rules of the game

- 1) Each state will enter a team consisting of five people (preferably a mixed team).
- 2) Each team decides the order they want to attempt each of the seven stations and the level of difficulty. This information is presented to the co-ordinator (Anat) 30 minutes prior to the game commencing (see example below).

Example station order: Queensland team (Michael, Ben, David, Sarah and Avi)

2 Hard

4 Easy

5 Middle

1 Hard

6 Easy

7 Easy

3 Hard

3) Each station has three levels of difficulty: the hardest level equals 5 points, the middle level equals 4 points and the easiest level equals 3 points. Questions and activities at each station are devised according to the level of difficulty selected by the team. The exact questions and activities will not be known by the teams until they reach each station.

4) Each team will be allowed 10 minutes at each station to answer a group of questions or have to undertake an activity related to the level of difficulty chosen.
